Series Title Slide: A New Frontier and clear audio

We're in a series today called "A New Frontier." Our lives can feel like an adventure. We face tough challenges, have to work with other people, and usually have to work to get where we want to be. In this series, we'll be finding out how God can lead us every day of our lives.

Have you ever gone out on a super dark night and just looked up at the stars? There are so many, and each one is so far away, it's easy to feel small. Sometimes, all of us

probably feel small, but today we're going to see that God, the one who made every star, knows you, and cares about you, and always listens when you talk to Him.
We'll learn more about that in a bit, but let's get started with a game called "Impossible trivia."
Game Title Slide: "Impossible Trivia"
In this game, I'm going to read off two things that might sound "impossible." The catch is, one of the two things is totally true. Your job is to guess which one is true. You'll vote by pointing in the direction of the one you think is true. Let's go to our first impossible choice!
