About this Series:

Have you ever gone on an adventure? You might learn new things, overcome obstacles, and explore new places along the way. Living a life following God can be an adventure, too! In this series, we'll take a look at people in the Bible and the adventure they had following God.

Joshua 1:9 – "Be strong and brave. Do not be terrified. Do not lose hope. I am the Lord your God. I will be with you everywhere you go."

Lesson 1: Get Ready for an Adventure!

When you go out on an adventure, it's important to be prepared. This week, we'll see how God prepared Noah so he would be ready for the flood.

Lesson 2: Choose Your Leader

On any adventure, it is important to choose a leader who knows where to go and the best way to get there. God is the best leader we could ever have to guide us through life. This week, we'll take a look at Abraham's story and how he chose to follow God into a new land.

Lesson 3: Never Go Alone

Adventures can be full of ups and downs. It's important to have someone who will stick with us through it all. This week, we'll learn that God is always with us no matter what we go through.

Lesson 4: Overcome Obstacles

At times during an adventure, we'll run into obstacles and wonder what to do. This week, we'll hear the story of Moses and the huge obstacle that was in his way. We'll discover that we can do hard things with God by our side.

Lesson 5: Serve One Another

On any adventure, it is important to help other people along the way. That's exactly what some friends did for Moses when they were in the middle of a battle. This week, we'll discover that all of us can find a way to serve others.

Lesson 6: Don't Give Up

When things get tough on the trail, it can be tempting to give up. This week, we'll hear the story of Joshua and how he showed perseverance when it could have been easy to stop.

Lesson 7: Trust Your Leader

On any adventure, it's important to have a leader you can trust. This week, Gideon will discover that he can trust God to lead him.

Lesson 8: Work as a Team

As we adventure through life, it's important to have some good friends who will stay by our side. This week, we'll see how Ruth was a good friend and learn how we can be a good friend to others.

Lesson 9: Be Brave

On our adventure, we might need to do something courageous that we've never done before. This week, we'll learn how we can be brave, just like David was brave as he fought against Goliath.

Lesson 10: Make Wise Choices

During an adventure, there are often choices to be made. Which way should we go? How are we going to get there? A man named Solomon knew how important it was to have wisdom and this week we'll learn how we can make wise choices.

Lesson 11: Ask for Help

Sometimes we can find ourselves in a tricky situation. Who do we go to when we need help? Nehemiah ran into some trouble as he was building a wall, but he knew he could ask God to help him. This week, we'll learn that we can talk to God and ask him for help, too!

Lesson 12: Purpose in the Journey

On an adventure, we need to keep taking the next step and following our guide. This week, we'll discover that God had a plan for Esther's life, and he has a plan for each one of us, too. We can follow God wherever he leads us!

Lesson 13: Celebrate the Victories

When an adventure is over, we can look back and celebrate all that we did together. David was a man in the Bible who went on a lot of adventures with God. This week, we'll learn that David wrote songs to worship God and celebrate what God had done in his life.

Introduction and Rules

Welcome everyone! My name is _____, and I'm so excited to see each and every one of you! During our time together, we'll get to sing a couple songs, hear an awesome story, and go on a super fun adventure together! Before we do any of that, there are three important things for you to remember.

Know This: This is a great opportunity to set the tone and expectations for your time together. Kids like to know what's expected of them too—it helps them feel safe and secure. You can make this section informative, helpful, and fun all at the same time!

Rule #1: When I'm talking you are listening!

Let's put on our listening ears and turn them way up! On the count of three, let's practice our very best listening. Ready? 1, 2, 3!

Rule #2: Keep your hands and feet to yourself!

We want this to be a great place for all you leaders and Kid-Os, which means no poking, kicking, or bugging your neighbor. A good way to remember this rule is to: do a little clap and place your hands in your lap!

Rule #3: Stay in your spot!

You have a spot of your very own here in Kid-O-Deo, and it's right where you are sitting! It's important for us to stay in our spots, so that everyone can pay attention and have fun!

Great job listening to our rules. The rules are really great because they can help us learn and have lots of fun while we're here.

Big Idea

I love singing with you, Kid-Os! You can sit down. We are in a series called "Adventure Awaits!" Have you ever gone on an adventure? You might learn new things, overcome obstacles, or explore new trails. Living a life following God can feel like an adventure, too.

Today, we're going to go on an adventure together! To get started, we're going to need a backpack with some supplies. Let's take a look inside to find out what we're bringing with us on our adventure today!

Do This: Show Kid-Os the backpack and take items out one by one. Attach each picture to a hook on the poster board so kids can see them.

Let's see, we have some rocks, some binoculars, and a rope. There's also a mystery item. I wonder what it could be?

Let's get started by putting on our backpacks and flying like an airplane over to the Big Idea. Can you do that with me?

Do This: Have kids put on imaginary backpacks and pretend to fly with you.



Big Idea Jingle



(Auto advance) Big Idea Slide: I can be a good friend and family member.

Awesome job! We made it! The Big Idea is, “I can be a good friend and family member.” Let’s practice the big idea together. I’ll say a part first and you can repeat after me. I can be, I CAN BE. A good friend. A GOOD FRIEND. And family member, AND FAMILY MEMBER. Great job! Alright, now let’s say it all together!

Do This: Show Kid-Os the actions and have them practice the Big Idea with you three times. Use a different voice each time. **Voice ideas for this week: Clucking Chicken, Motorboat Singing.**

Know This: These are the Big Idea actions: (Place your hands in front of your face, palms out, then move them down in a rainbow motion) The Big Idea. (Point at self) I can be, (put one thumb up) a good friend, (put the other thumb up) and family member.

Awesome job practicing our Big Idea! You can all sit down.

That Big Idea is so important, we’re going to say it several times during our adventure. Whenever we get through one of the obstacles on our path, we’ll say the Big Idea!

Bible Adventure

Next, we get to learn more by going on a Bible Adventure, but look! There’s a mountain in our path!



Mountain Image

Which item from our backpack do you think we need to climb up this mountain – the rocks, the binoculars, or the rope?

Do This: Pause and let kids answer.

Hmm...I know ropes are good for climbing so that can help us climb this mountain! Can you take out your rope? Now, let's throw it up on the mountain. Ready? Throw! Ok, let's all hold on to the rope and climb!

Do This: Pretend to throw the rope onto the mountain and climb up it together.

Whew! That was hard work, but we made it!



Big Idea Slide

Let's practice our Big Idea together. THE BIG IDEA. I CAN BE A GOOD FRIEND AND FAMILY MEMBER. Awesome job! Now, let's sit down and get ready for a Bible Adventure!



Bible Adventure Jingle

Do This: Show kids the Bible.

The Bible is the greatest book ever. It's full of words from God. There are also true stories in the Bible about people who had some adventures while they followed God! Today, we get to read about a woman named Ruth and how she was a good friend and family member.

Do This: Get the Bible storybook out and sit down in the chair.

This story you are going to hear comes from the Bible, but we use this storybook because the pictures help us imagine what it might have looked like back when the Bible was written. The pictures you see in here are the same as the ones on the screen. Let's get started!

Do This: Have kids help you "turn" the pages on the screen with an exaggerated arm wave.



Picture 1: Naomi and two daughters far from home.

Naomi was living in a land that was far away from her home. While she was there, her husband and her two sons died. The only family members she had left were her sons' wives named Orpah (Or-pa) and Ruth. Naomi decided she should leave and go back to her hometown. She would start a new life there.



Picture 2: Naomi hugging daughters.

Orpah and Ruth started to follow her, but Naomi stopped them and said, “Go back to your own homes. You will have a better life if you stay there. You have both been so kind to me and I pray that God would be kind to you.” They all cried, and Naomi kissed her daughters goodbye.



Picture 3: Naomi and Ruth talking together.

Orpah decided to go back to her home, but Ruth refused to leave Naomi. Ruth said, “Don’t make me leave you. Where you go, I’ll go. Where you stay, I’ll stay. Your people will be my people. Your God will be my God. Nothing will be able to separate us.”



Picture 4: Naomi and Ruth traveling.

Naomi realized that Ruth had made up her mind to go with her. Together, they traveled back to Naomi’s hometown. Ruth was a good friend and family member to Naomi. She was loyal, helpful, and kind.



Series Title Slide: Adventure Awaits!

Great listening, Kid-Os! All of us can be good friends and family members by being loyal and kind, just like Ruth.

Next, we’re going to head over to our Memory Verse, but it looks like there is something blocking our path.



River Image

We need to cross over to the other side of this river! Let’s see if there is something in our backpack that will help us cross this river. Do you think we should use the rocks or the binoculars?

Do This: Point at the items. Let kids give their answer.

Yes, the rocks! We can throw these rocks into the river and then hop across them. Let's pick up the rocks and throw them into the river. Great! Now let's hop from rock to rock until we get across the river.

Do This: Have Kid-Os pretend to throw rocks into the river and then hop across them.

Way to go, Kid-Os!



Big Idea Slide

Now that we are across the river, let's say our Big Idea together. THE BIG IDEA. I CAN BE A GOOD FRIEND AND FAMILY MEMBER. Awesome job! You can sit down.

Memory Verse

Memory Verse Jingle



(Auto-advance) Memory Verse: Joshua 1:9 – “Be strong and brave. Do not be terrified. Do not lose hope. I am the Lord your God. I will be with you everywhere you go.”

Our Memory Verse comes from the Bible. This verse is all about being strong and brave because God is always with us.

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

Ruth was strong and brave when she went with Naomi into a new land.

Do This: Practice the verse with the Kid-Os three times. You can start in your quiet/whisper voice and then get a little louder each time you practice.

Know This: The verse with actions goes like this: (Open your Bibles) Joshua 1:9. (Flex arm muscles) Be strong and brave. (Move hands back and forth in front of you with palms down) Do not be terrified. (Move hands back and forth in front of you with palms down)) Do not lose hope. (Point up) I am the Lord your God. (Point out) I will be with you. (march in place) everywhere you go.”

Awesome singing, everyone! You can sit down. Oh, wow! Look what's in front of us now!



Forest

It's a big forest and we have to figure out how to get through to the other side! What do you think we should use that might help us see how to get through this forest?

Do This: Point at the items from the backpack and let kids give their answer.

Yes, the binoculars! They can help us see all the way to the other side of this forest. Can you look through your binoculars and walk through the forest with me?

Do This: Hold up the binoculars and have the kids do the same. Pretend to walk through the forest, using the binoculars to help you.

We made it!



Big Idea Slide

Let's say our Big Idea one more time. THE BIG IDEA. I CAN BE A GOOD FRIEND AND FAMILY MEMBER. Great job! You can sit down, because now it's time to try out what we've been learning today.
