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Series at a Glance for Kid-O-Deo (continued)

Lesson 1: God Made Relationships

To kick off this series on relationships, we're going to look at the story of creation. God created each one of us to be connected to him and to other people. This week, we'll discover that we can all be good friends and family members.

Lesson 2: Love Others

Every person is created by God, but we are not all the same. God made us with unique personalities, likes and dislikes, and abilities. Even though we are different, Jesus shows us the importance of loving one another through the story of the Good Samaritan.

Lesson 3: Forgive Others

Relationships aren't always easy. Sometimes we get into arguments or someone isn't nice to us. This week, we'll discover that an important part of any relationship is learning how to forgive.

Lesson 4: Be Loyal

Loyalty means sticking with someone in good times and hard times. All of us need friends and family members who will be by our side no matter what. This week, we'll hear the story of Ruth and how she was loyal to Naomi.

Lesson 5: Use Kind Words

Our words are so important – they can be kind, or they can hurt others. This week, we'll look at an example of kind words in the Bible when Paul encourages Timothy.

Lesson 6: Help Others

Do you ever need a little help from someone? All of us do! One way to be a good friend and family member is to be helpful. This week, we'll read the story of Moses and Aaron to see an example of two brothers helping one another.

Lesson 7: Share

Our relationships are better when we are willing to share with others. This week, we'll discover that all of us have something we can share with our family and friends.

Lesson 8: Friends of Jesus

When Jesus lived on the earth, he invited the disciples to be his friends. They followed Jesus' example and made him the leader in their life. Jesus invites each one of us to follow him, too.

Introduction and Rules

Welcome everyone! My name is _____, and I'm super excited to see each and every one of you! During our time together, we'll get to sing a couple fun songs, learn a memory verse, and hear an awesome story. Before we do any of that, there are three important things for you to remember.

Know This: This is a great opportunity to set the tone and expectations for your time together. Kids like to know what's expected of them too—it helps them feel safe and secure. You can make this section informative, helpful, and fun all at the same time!

Rule #1: When I'm talking you are listening!

Let's put on our listening ears and turn them way up! On the count of three, let's practice our very best listening. Ready? 1, 2, 3!

Rule #2: Keep your hands and feet to yourself!

Let's hold up our hands and wiggle our fingers! Now, give a little clap and put your hands in your lap!

Rule #3: Stay in your spot!

You have a spot of your very own here in Kid-O-Deo, and it's right where you are sitting! It's important for us to stay in our spots, so that everyone can pay attention and have fun!

Great job listening to our rules. The rules are really great because they can help us learn and have lots of fun while we're here.

Big Idea

I love singing with you, Kid-Os! You can sit down. We are in a series called "Connected." When you put together a puzzle, each piece is connected to the others. God made each one of us to be connected to him and to other people. In this series, we'll learn how to be good friends and family members.

Let's get started by practicing our "Big Idea." That's the super important thing we're learning about today!



Big Idea Jingle



(Auto advance) Big Idea Slide: I can share what I have.

The Big Idea is, "I can share what I have." Let's stand up and practice the big idea. I'll say a part first and you can repeat after me. I can share, I CAN SHARE. What I have, WHAT I HAVE. Great job! Alright, now let's say it all together!

Do This: Show Kid-Os the actions and have them practice the Big Idea with you three times. Use a different voice each time. **Voice ideas for this week: floating astronaut, puppy, bouncing bunny.**

Know This: These are the Big Idea actions: (Place your hands in front of your face, palms out, then move them down in a rainbow motion) The Big Idea. (Hold out both hands) I can share (Point at yourself) what I have.

Awesome job practicing our Big Idea! You can all sit down.

That Big Idea is so important, we're going to say it several times today. Whenever you hear this sound, it's time to say our big idea!



Big Idea Puzzle Piece and Sound

Every time we say the Big Idea, we'll earn a puzzle piece. At the end of our time together, we'll get to see the finished puzzle! You can say the Big Idea and still do the actions while sitting in your spot. Let's practice right now!



Big Idea Puzzle Piece and Sound

Let's say the Big Idea together. THE BIG IDEA. I CAN SHARE WHAT I HAVE. Great job, Kid-Os!

We've earned our first puzzle piece! Let's put it on our board.

Do This: Place the puzzle piece on the white board. You can put it anywhere and it doesn't matter which piece you choose.

Bible Adventure

Great job, Kid-Os! I can't wait to see the picture we're making! Next, we get to learn more by going on a Bible Adventure.



Bible Adventure Jingle

Do This: Show kids the Bible.

The Bible is the greatest book ever. It's full of words from God, and there are lots of true stories about people who loved God in the Bible too! Today, we get to read a story about how people in the first church shared what they had.

Do This: Get the Bible storybook out and sit down in the chair.

This story you are going to hear comes from the Bible, but we use this storybook because the pictures help us imagine what it might have looked like back when the Bible was written. The pictures you see in here are the same as the ones on the screen. Let's get started!

Do This: Have kids help you "turn" the pages on the screen with an exaggerated arm wave.



Picture 1: Disciples telling people about Jesus.

Before Jesus left the disciples, he gave them a very important job. Their job was to tell everyone about how much Jesus loves them. Many people decided to follow Jesus. They began meeting together and were called "the church."



Picture 2: People gathered together praying.

The people who were part of the church spent a lot of time together. They learned more about God, and they prayed for each other. They also ate food together and shared everything they had.



Picture 3: People gathered together eating.

If someone needed food, the people in the church gave them food. If someone needed clothes, people shared their clothes. If someone had more than they needed, they shared it with the people in the church.



Picture 4: People of the church filled with joy.

Because people shared, everyone in the church had what they needed and were full of joy. The followers of Jesus gave thanks to God for everything they had. Each day, more people decided to follow Jesus and be a part of the church.

Memory Verse Jingle



(Auto-advance) Memory Verse: 1 John 4:11 – “Dear friends, since God loved us this much, we should also love one another.”

Our Memory Verse comes from the Bible. This one is all about God's love for us and how we can share that love with others.

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

One of the ways we can love others is by sharing what we have. Now let's stand up and practice this memory verse together.

Do This: Practice the verse with the Kid-Os three times. You can start in your quiet/whisper voice and then get a little louder each time you practice.

Know This: The verse with actions goes like this: (Open your Bibles) 1 John 4:11. (Point up as you say the word “God”) Dear friends, since God loved us (stretch both arms out as wide as you can) this much, (cross arms over chest) we should also love one another.

Super job practicing your Memory Verse, Kid-Os!

Do This: Place the puzzle piece on the white board, but don't connect the pieces yet.

Super job, Kid-Os! We almost have all the pieces! Now it's time to try out what we've been learning today.

Big Idea Puzzle Piece and Sound

I know what that sound means! We need to say our Big Idea together one more time. Ready? THE BIG IDEA. I CAN SHARE WHAT I HAVE. Nice job, Kid-Os! We've earned our last puzzle piece!

Do This: Place the final puzzle piece on the white board.

Now that we have all four puzzle pieces, let's put them together!

Do This: Put together the puzzle pieces on the white board. Allow kids to verbally help you find where the pieces go if that works well with your group of kids.

I love that! Rosie the Rabbit is sharing a toy with Tweet. That makes me think about what we learned today – we can share what we have! It could be a toy, some food, or something else.
