Lesson 1: September 11/12

Opening Song and Welcome



(Roll when directed) Elevate Opener

Do This: During the song, encourage kids to find a place to sit, and let them know it's time to get started.


Hey everybody! It's so good to see you! Let's get started. Come on up and find a place to sit.



My name is _____, and I'm so excited to be here with all of you!

Elevate is an awesome place where we get to have fun and learn about God. It's also a place where we show respect. We <u>respect the leaders</u> in here by listening and following their instructions. We <u>respect others</u> by being kind and keeping our hands to ourselves. And we <u>respect the room</u> by being safe, and not damaging anything. Showing respect like that helps us all have a great time together.

Team Time 14:00



We're in a series today called "Cinematic." The word "cinematic" means "like a movie," or like making a movie. A movie set is filled with people in all kinds of roles. Some are backstage, some are in the spotlight. Some people are directing, some are on a set for the first time. It's all those relationships that make the movie succeed or fail. In this series, we'll learn how we can have great relationships with others whether we are center-stage or behind the scenes.

Let's get	started with a game called "Skit-ish".
	Game Title Slide: Skit-ish

In this game, your goal is to make a movie scene based on a story I give you. You'll have 7 minutes to prepare, and 1 minute to perform your scene, so keep it simple! No need to get complicated. If you're more comfortable giving suggestions instead of acting in the skit, that's OK too. We're going to divide up into our small groups, and you'll need to work as a team to come up with something fun and entertaining.

Do This: Encourage kids to look for the flag that matches their grade and to meet up with their group there. Make sure that all the groups have an adult to read through the skit scenarios and help the groups plan.

Know This: There are four scenarios, and each group should have a different scenario. You will need to combine the two smallest grades to get four groups. You may also combine smaller groups if necessary to make fewer groups than four if there are very few kids.

Know This: The goal of the first game is to give kids an opportunity to get to know one another, which helps them go deeper in small group conversations later.

Are you ready? Here's the kind of story you'll be telling in your skits:



You'll be acting out a superhero "origin story!" An "origin story" is a story that tells how a superhero became a hero. We've got stories featuring brand-new superheroes you've never heard of before, written out on cards for you to read. Remember, you've only got 7 minutes to prep and 1 minute to tell your story, so keep it short, keep it simple, and have fun with it! Ready...? GO!



Start a 7-minute timer (and play some light music!)

Do This: Walk throughout the room to see how the kids are doing as they put their skits together. If kids are engaged and things are going well, give them space to do their thing. If a group seems stuck, walk over and gently suggest a few ideas to help them get organized. **Encourage each group to pick someone as their narrator.**

Do This: As time ticks by, announce updates to the room to help them know how much time they have left. With 3 minutes left, they should have chosen their story. With 2 minutes left, they should have chosen their roles in the story and be starting to practice.

Do This: Once the timer reaches 0:00, call everyone back from their groups to regather as a large group.



Alright everyone! I hope you're feeling good about your skits! Come join us back in the center of the room. I am so excited to see your creativity! Who's ready to go first?

Do This: Select a willing group to present first. If no group volunteers, suggest one.



1:00 Countdown Timer



Play a 1-minute timer to keep things moving, return to the Series Title Slide after the timer has elapsed.

Do This: Watch the kids perform their skits. If a skit appears it may go slightly over time, that's alright. If a skit has gone on notably long, gently let the team know that their time is up and thank them for their performance.


Do This: Instead of advancing slides, replay the 1-minute timer for each group that performs.

Question of the Day Video



(Auto Advance) QOTD Slide: When is a time something seemed too easy for you?

Our question today is: When is a time something seemed *too* easy for you? Like, you can do this thing with no problem at all. This might be something like a math problem that your teacher said would be hard and you thought it wasn't, or a song you can

play on an instrument with no trouble. Turn to someone near you and tell them about it! Make sure to listen to their answer, too.


Do This: Allow kids to talk for about 30 seconds. **Know This**: You can share your answer briefly, too!

Media Part 1: Big Problem


Do This: Make sure each kid finds their group. Help group leaders if there is a need. Encourage kids as they work to discuss the question.


Alright, come on back from your groups! Let's see what more we can learn about humility. Check out the screens for Part three of The Elevate Show.
