



Group Time Guide

Supplies Needed: DIY Comic Pages, pens/pencils.

1. Activity

Say This: Blake is working on creating a character for his comic book today. For our activity, we get to create our own comics, too!

Do This: Give each kid a DIY comic page and make drawing utensils available. Then, read out the instructions below.

Say This: First, draw a character in the largest box. Give them a name. Then, decide other things about them. How old are they? What do they do? Use your imagination!

Do This: Give them a minute to draw, then move on to the discussion. Let them know that they could take the page home and fill in the other boxes to make a story later.

Discuss: What character did you make? Why did you make them that way?

The Point: You made your characters the way they are for a reason. You made them look a certain way, do different things, and the more we worked on this project, the more different things we would find. God made every one of us the way we are, too. He knows you and loves you, just the way He made you to be.

2. Discussion Time

Look Up and Read: Psalm 139:14. This is a verse about how God made each of us. **Discussion Questions**:

- How does that verse say God made us? (Amazing and wonderful.)
- Why do you think Taylor is having such a tough day? (She feels angry and sad, she doesn't know what God wants her to do.) What advice would you give her?
- When you made your characters earlier, you thought carefully about how to make them. Do you think God does that with us? (Yes) How does that make you feel?

Ask: How is this week going for you? Is there anything you want God's help with? **Pray**: Talk to God, including relevant things mentioned in your discussion.
