Lesson 1: Being a Friend

How do you find a great friend? This week, we'll hear about how Jesus met some of His closest friends and learn why making good friends starts with being a good friend.

Lesson 2: Being Kind

What does a good friend do? On our walk through the forest this week, we'll hear a story Jesus told about how kindness is an important part of being a good friend.

Lesson 3: Telling the Truth

When Zacchaeus met Jesus, his life was completely changed. One of the biggest differences was that Zacchaeus began telling the truth. This week, we'll see how honesty can make a huge difference in our lives, too!

Lesson 4: Listening

What are some things you listen to? This week, we'll see how listening can help us be a good friend and family member and hear the story of someone who was so busy, they almost forgot to listen to Jesus.

Lesson 5: Helping

Everyone needs help sometimes, even grown-ups! This week, we'll hear how Ruth helped her grown-up in a really tough time and think of ways we can help others today.

Lesson 6: Sharing

Sharing with others makes a difference! Just ask a young boy who shared his lunch with Jesus and ended up sharing it with thousands of people! We'll find out what happened this week.

Lesson 7: Forgiving

When we have friends, we'll sometimes need to forgive. This week, we'll hear about a time when Jesus had to forgive one of his friends and see how we can follow His example and forgive others.

Lesson 8: Believing

Jesus shows us how to be good friends, family members, and neighbors, but most of all, He shows us that God loves us! Every one of us can choose to be Jesus' friend and follower today.

Introduction and Rules

Welcome everyone! My name is _____, and I'm super excited to see each and every one of you! I am so glad that all of you are here. During our time together, we'll get to sing a couple fun songs, practice our memory verse, and hear an awesome story. Before we do any of that, there are three important things for you to remember. They are our Kid-O-Deo rules!

Know This: This is an opportunity to set the tone and expectations for your time together. Kids like to know what's expected of them too—it helps them feel safe and secure. You can make this section informative, helpful, and fun all at the same time!

Rule #1: When I'm talking you are listening!

Please put on your listening ears and turn them way up! Now, on the count of three, let's practice being very quiet and listening! 1, 2, 3!

Rule #2: Keep your hands and feet to yourself!

We want this to be a fun place for all you leaders and Kid-Os, which means no poking, kicking, or bugging your neighbor.

Rule #3: Stay in your spot!

Let's take our special glue sticks and put some glue on our spot! This glue is special because it helps you sit when it's time to listen, but it lets you stand when it's time to do things like sing.

Great job listening to our rules. The rules are really great because they help us learn and have lots of fun while we're here!

Big Idea

It's so fun singing with you, Kid-Os! You can sit down. We're in a series called "Forest Friends." Our Kid-O-Deo forest friends have been showing us around their forest and helping us learn more about being good friends and family members. Right now, one of our forest friends wants to help us learn something important called our "Big Idea."

Our Big Idea is the one big thing we're learning about today. Let's find out what it is!



Big Idea Jingle



(Auto advance) Big Idea Slide: I can forgive.

Thanks Frank the Frog! The Big Idea today is, "I can forgive." Can you repeat that after me? The Big Idea. THE BIG IDEA. I can forgive. I CAN FORGIVE.

Forgiving someone means choosing to not be mad at them after they've done something wrong. It means not reminding them of what they did wrong or being mean back to them.

Do This: Show Kid-Os the actions and have them practice the Big Idea with you three times. Use a different voice each time. **Voice ideas for this week: Growly bear, big whale, tiny mouse.**

Know This: These are the Big Idea actions: (Palms face out with arms in front of you and move hands downward and to the sides) The Big Idea (Thumbs point toward self) I can (hold right hand with fist across your chest) forgive.

Awesome job practicing our Big Idea! You can all sit down.

All day today, we need to remember that big idea about sharing. Anytime today, if you hear the Big Idea Bugle which sounds like this...

...then it means we need to say our Big Idea to keep going with the lesson. You can say it and still do the actions while you're sitting in your spot. Let's practice!

Bible Adventure

We have some forest friends with us today! This is Rocky the Raccoon, Tweet the Bird, Mr. Bear, and Waddles the Duck.

Our forest friends are going to lead us deeper into the forest for our Bible Adventure. Let's go!



Bible Adventure Jingle


Do This: Show kids the Bible.

The Bible is an amazing book all about God and His people. The Bible helps us learn more about God's Son, Jesus, and about the way God made us to live. Today we get to read a story about a time when one of Jesus' closest friends was unkind to him, and we'll find out what Jesus did.

Do This: Get the Bible storybook out and sit down in the chair.

This story you are going to hear comes from the Bible, but we use this storybook because the pictures help us imagine what it might have looked like back when the Bible was written. The pictures you see in here are the same as the ones on the screen. Let's get started!

Do This: Have kids help you "turn" the pages on the screen with an exaggerated arm wave.



Picture 1: Jesus and Peter

God's Son Jesus was very good friends with a man named Peter. Jesus's friends were known as the disciples. They traveled all over together. Peter saw Jesus do amazing things, like walk on water, and heal people who were sick.



Picture 2: Last Supper

Peter promised that he would be with Jesus no matter what. Jesus told Peter that something bad was going to happen soon, but Peter didn't listen.



Picture 3: Jesus captured

That night, Jesus was captured by people who didn't like Him, and didn't know that He was God's Son. They hurt Jesus and made fun of Him. They said He did wrong things, even though He hadn't. Peter watched from a long way away. When someone asked Peter if he knew Jesus, he said "I've never seen him before." Did Peter break his promise? YES.



Picture 4: Jesus comes back to life

Jesus would die later that day, but because Jesus was God's Son, His story wasn't finished. On the third day, Jesus came back to life! He did that so all of us could be

forgiven for every wrong thing we've done. Jesus wanted Peter to know that he was forgiven, too.



Picture 5: Breakfast on the beach

After He came back to life, Jesus talked with Peter and the other disciples. He told Peter that even though Peter broke his promise, Jesus still loved him. Jesus forgave Peter, just like He forgives us!

(Auto-advance) Memory Verse: Proverbs 17:17 - A friend loves at all times.

It's time to practice our Memory Verse! Our Memory Verses come from the Bible.

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

Our Memory Verse means that being a friend means loving other people. Forgiving others is an important way to love them. Remember, forgiving someone means choosing to not be mad at them, like Jesus did for Peter. Let's say our memory verse together!

Do This: Practice the verse with the Kid-Os three times. Start crouching down and use your small/little voice, then stand squatting slightly and use your medium voice, and then stand on your tippy toes and use your big voice!

Know This: The verse with actions goes like this: (Open your Bibles) Proverbs 17:17 (Arms crossed over chest with palms closed) A friend loves (hands out in front of you with palms up, then move hands out to your sides) at all times.


