Lesson 4: Listening

What are some things you listen to? This week, we'll see how listening can help us be a good friend and family member and hear the story of someone who was so busy, they almost forgot to listen to Jesus.

Lesson 5: Helping

Everyone needs help sometimes, even grown-ups! This week, we'll hear how Ruth helped her grown-up in a really tough time and think of ways we can help others today.

Lesson 6: Sharing

Sharing with others makes a difference! Just ask a young boy who shared his lunch with Jesus and ended up sharing it with thousands of people! We'll find out what happened this week.

Lesson 7: Forgiving

When we have friends, we'll sometimes need to forgive. This week, we'll hear about a time when Jesus had to forgive one of his friends and see how we can follow His example and forgive others.

Introduction and Rules

Welcome everyone! My name is _____, and I'm super excited to see each and every one of you! If you are a new friend here with us today for the first or second time, welcome! We are so glad that you're here. During our time together, we'll get to sing a couple fun songs, practice our memory verse, and hear an awesome story. Before we do any of that, there are three important things for you to remember. They are our Kid-O-Deo rules!

Do This: Spend some extra time explaining the rules as there will likely be several new Kid-Os in your space. There are examples of language you can use within the listing of the three rules, but whatever you say here, try to make sure it's consistent across the Large Group Leaders at your campus.

Know This: This is a great opportunity to set the tone and expectations for your time together. Kids like to know what's expected of them too—it helps them feel safe and secure. You can make this section informative, helpful, and fun all at the same time!

Rule #1: *When I'm talking you are listening!*

We have so many great things to do together today, and that's why we want to make sure everyone follows this first rule. It's so important that we are going to practice

it right now. Please put on your listening ears and turn them way up! Now, on the count of three, let's practice being very quiet and listening! 1, 2, 3!

Rule #2: Keep your hands and feet to yourself!

We want this to be a great place for all you leaders and Kid-Os, which means no poking, kicking, or bugging your neighbor. A good way to remember this rule is to: do a little clap and place your hands in your lap!

Rule #3: Stay in your spot!

Everyone has a spot here in Kid-O-Deo, and your spot today can be right where you're sitting. When there are Kid-Os running around or coming on the stage, it can make it really hard to learn and have fun. So, let's take our special glue sticks and put some glue on our spot! This glue is special because it helps you sit when it's time to listen, but it lets you stand when it's time to do things like sing.

Great job listening to our rules. The rules are really great because they can help us learn and have lots of fun while we're here!

Big Idea

It's so fun singing with you, Kid-Os! You can sit down. We're in our second week of a series called "Forest Friends." During this series, we get to meet lots different friends here in the forest and hear all about how we can be friends with others.

Here in Kid-O-Deo, we love to practice something called our "Big Idea." This is something so important, we should all remember it. Let's learn the Big Idea together!



Big Idea Jingle



(Auto advance) Big Idea Slide: I can be kind.

Frank the Frog wants to know what our Big Idea is! The Big Idea is, "I can be kind." Can you repeat that after me? The Big Idea. THE BIG IDEA. I can be kind. I CAN BE KIND!

Do This: Show Kid-Os the actions and have them practice the Big Idea with you three times. Use a different voice each time. **Voice ideas for this week: Beautiful Butterfly, Chattering Chimpanzee, Big Bear.**

Know This: These are the Big Idea actions: (Palms face out with arms in front of you and move hands downward and to the sides) The Big Idea (Thumbs point toward self) I can (Place hands one on top of the other over chest with palms facing in) be kind.

Awesome job practicing our Big Idea! You can all sit down.

We'll hear more about being kind today. Throughout our time together, if you hear the Big Idea Bugle which sounds like this...

...then it means we need to say our Big Idea to keep going with the lesson. You can say it and still do the actions while you're sitting in your spot. Let's practice!

Bible Adventure

Next it's time to explore deeper into the forest for our Bible Adventure. Let's go!



Bible Adventure Jingle

Do This: Show kids the Bible.

The Bible is an amazing book from God. It has stories about God and His Son, Jesus, and it tells us about how God made us to live. Today we are going to hear a story that Jesus told when He was here on earth. It's about how to be a kind friend!

Do This: Get the Bible storybook out and sit down in the chair.

This story you are going to hear comes from the Bible, but we use this storybook because the pictures help us imagine what it might have looked like back when the Bible was written. The pictures you see in here are the same as the ones on the screen. Let's get started!

Do This: Have kids help you "turn" the pages on the screen with an exaggerated arm wave.



Picture 1: Jesus talking with the religious leader

One day Jesus was talking to a man who knew a lot of things about God. This man asked Jesus a question. He wanted to know how to live God's way. He knew he was supposed to love others and be kind, but he wanted to know who he was supposed to be kind to. So, Jesus told this man a story. Here's how Jesus' story went:

There was a man who was on his way to a city called Jericho. As he was going down the road, some robbers came up to him and attacked him! *Can you say, "Oh no!" OH NO!* The robbers tore his clothes and hurt him really badly. Then they just left him lying on the ground. That is not very kind at all! This man really needed a friend.

While the hurt man was lying near the road, someone came walking by. He saw the man who had been wounded, but he didn't help him. Instead, he walked past him on the other side of the road. Then a second man came by. He even went over and looked at the man who was hurt, but he didn't help the hurt man either. He did the same thing as the first man and just walked past on the other side!

Then a third man came traveling down the same road on a donkey. He was from Samaria, so he was called a Samaritan. *Can you say Samaritan? SAMARITAN.* The hurt man was not a Samaritan though; he was called a Jew. Jews and Samaritans usually

didn't like each other. What was this Samaritan going to do? Would he walk by the hurt man just like the other two people had done? Let's find out!

The Samaritan chose to be kind to the hurt man! He poured oil on his cuts and scrapes, and he bandaged them up. *Raise your hand if you have ever had a bandage or Band-Aid for a scrape.* This man would have needed lots of bandages because he was hurt so badly! The Samaritan put the man on his own donkey and brought him to a place where he could rest and get better. That's a super kind thing to do!

Great listening, Kid-Os! Jesus' story helped the man he was talking to learn that God wanted him to be kind to everyone. And you know what? God wants all of us to be kind to everyone too! We can be kind to our neighbors, family members, friends at school—or anyone else we meet. Being kind is a great way to be a friend. That reminds me of our Big Idea!

It's the Big Idea Bugle! Friends, to move on to the next part of our lesson, let's say our Big Idea together. THE BIG IDEA. I CAN BE KIND!

It's time to practice our Memory Verse! Our Memory Verses come from the Bible.

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

Our Memory Verse means that we can be a friend to others by showing that we love them. One way to love others is to be kind! The Samaritan in our Bible Adventure

story was super kind, when he helped the man who was hurt, and cared about him. That's what our memory verse is about!

Do This: Practice the verse with the Kid-Os three times. Start crouching down and use your small/little voice, then stand squatting slightly and use your medium voice, and then stand on your tippy toes and use your big voice!

Know This: The verse with actions goes like this: (Open your Bibles) Proverbs 17:17 (Arms crossed over chest with palms closed) A friend loves (hands out in front of you with palms up, then move hands out to your sides) at all times.


