- 4. How do you handle correction? Are you open to it or do you get resentful? Going forward, how can you honor God in how you respond to correction?

This week, focus on building God's kingdom—not your own. Go out of your way to help someone in need. Offer godly wisdom to someone who needs it. Serve at a local non-profit. Each day, ask God how you can bring Him glory through your thoughts, words, and actions.
