

Group Time Guide

Supplies Needed: None

1. Introductions

Circle Up: Have Kid-Os sit down in a circle as quickly as they can and give you a "thumbs up" when they are ready to listen.

2. Discussion Questions

- How was Ruth faithful in our Bible Adventure story? (She stayed with Naomi like she said she would.)
- What does it mean to be faithful? (Doing what we say we will do.)

3. Activity

Say This: Part of being faithful to God is doing what he says we should do – things like loving others, being kind, sharing, and forgiving.

Do This: Play a game of Follow the Leader. Call out directions and have kids do the things you tell them to do.

Say This: Clap your hands, jump up and down, touch your toes, turn in a circle, wiggle your fingers, reach up high to the sky, touch your head, sit down and put your hands in your lap.

The Point: Just like we followed the leader in the game, one way we are faithful to God is by doing the things he says we should do.

4. Big Idea, Memory Verse, and Prayer

Do This: Practice the Big Idea and Memory Verse with the kids.

Memory Verse: Galatians 5:22-23 – "But the fruit the Holy Spirit produces is love, joy, and peace. It is being patient, kind, and good. It is being faithful and gentle and having self-control."

Big Idea: I can be faithful.

Do This: Encourage kids to talk about what they learned with their grown-ups.

Do This: Pray! "Dear God, we love you. Thank you for loving us. Help us to be faithful to you and to others. Amen."
