Group Time Guide

Supplies Needed: Trusting or Not Trusting story page

1. Introductions and Snack

Circle Up: Have the Kid-Os put their hands in the middle, count to three and yell Kid-O-Deo! Then have everyone sit down. Encourage each Kid-O to say their name.

Do This: Give kids hand sanitizer, then hand each of them a snack.

2. Discussion Questions

- Who trusted God in our Bible Adventure earlier? (Abraham)
- What do you think “trust” means? (Believing someone, relying on them.)

3. Hands-On Option

Do This: Read each of the “Trusting or Not Trusting” stories to the kids. Ask if the person in the story was trusting or not trusting. Have the kids show a thumbs-up for trusting, and thumbs-down for not trusting.

Know This: Thinking through these stories help kids picture a complex concept like trust.

The Point: Who we trust is super important. We trust our grown-ups, our leaders, and our friends, but the most important one to trust is God.

4. Big Idea, Memory Verse, Stickers, and Prayer

Do This: Practice the Big Idea and Memory Verse with the kids.

Memory Verse: Isaiah 9:2- “The people who are now living in darkness will see a great light.”

Big Idea: I can always trust God.

Do This: Give each kid a sticker. Encourage them to talk about what they learned with their grown-ups.

Do This: Pray! “Dear God, we love you. Thank you for loving us. Help us to always trust you. Amen.”
