Series Title Slide: Quest for a King and clear audio

We're in a series called "Quest for a King." A long time ago, people were waiting for God to send someone to save them and help them, they wanted a king, a leader. Today, we get to see who that was.

We'll hear that story in a few minutes, but first, we're going to play a game called "Real or Fake? Christmas edition."



Game Title Slide: "Real or Fake? Christmas Edition"

This is a game for your groups! I'm going to read you a Christmas fact, and your group's job is to guess whether it is real or fake. To answer, you'll either have to hold your hands up in a point like Christmas trees, or hold them down to make a wide circle like you are snowmen. I'll give you a minute to get into your groups and introduce yourselves, then read you the first fact!



Do This: Give kids time to get into their groups and meet the other group members.

Here's something I want you to remember today.



Jesus came to show everyone who God is.

Jesus came to show everyone who God is. He can show us what God really is like, because He is God! Jesus would tell his followers that if they knew him, they knew God, because he is God.



Series Title Slide: Quest for a King

This can be a little tough to understand, that God was in heaven, in charge of everything, but at the same time was on earth as Jesus. That's why we sometimes call Jesus "God's Son" or say "God sent Jesus," even though Jesus was completely God, too. You might wonder: how does that work? The truth is, we're not completely sure how that worked, because we're not God! It's kind of amazing that we get to learn more

about God all the time. No matter how much we learn, there will still be amazing mysteries like this to think about.

It might help to have an example, though. Here's one way to think about how this worked. Imagine you are writing a story.

Do This: Hold up a book and a pen. This section should be taught close to word-for-word. If necessary, put the following three paragraphs in the book to read as you hold it.

Book World Image

You create this huge world in your story, full of adventure and wonder. God made everything in our whole world, a little like a story. Except God's story isn't just words on a page, it's totally real, and we're all a part of it.

Next, you make people in the story. They each have their own unique life. Then, you want to be part of the story, too. Maybe the people need your help, or you just want them to know who you are. So, you write a character in the story that is you. Everything they do is what you would do, everything they say is what you would say. You're still writing the story, but at the same time, you're a part of the story.

That's kind of what it was like when God came to earth as Jesus. God was still in charge of everything, but he was also part of our story, as Jesus. In fact, Jesus is the most important part of this big story ever. Jesus shows us all who God is! Everything Jesus did is what God would do. Everything Jesus said is what God would say, because He was really God.

God promised that someone would come who could change everything, who would tell people what God was really like, and show how much he loves them. That was so important, God didn't send someone else to do that, he came to show us how much he loves us himself.

That's what is absolutely amazing about Christmas. It reminds us that God came to live here on earth as Jesus. He came as a helpless baby, to show us all how much He loves us.
