Introduction and Rules

Welcome everyone! My name is _____, and I'm so glad that you're all here. During our time together, we'll get to sing and dance to a couple fun songs, learn a memory verse, and hear an awesome story. Before we do any of that, there are three important things for you to remember. They're our three Kid-O-Deo rules!

Know This: This is a great opportunity to set the tone and expectations for your time together. Kids like to know what's expected of them too—it helps them feel safe and secure. You can make this section informative, helpful, and fun all at the same time!

Rule #1: When I'm talking you are listening!

Let's put on our listening ears and turn them way up! We'll also turn our voices way down, so that we can all listen super well.

Rule #2: Keep your hands and feet to yourself!

We want this to be a great place for all you leaders and Kid-Os, which means no poking, kicking, or bugging your neighbor. A good way to remember this rule is to: do a little clap and place your hands in your lap!

Rule #3: Stay in your spot!

You have a spot of your very own here in Kid-O-Deo, and it's right where you are sitting! It's important for us to stay in our spots, so that everyone can pay attention and have fun!

Great job listening to our rules. The rules are really great because they can help us learn and have lots of fun while we're here.

Big Idea

I love singing with you, Kid-Os! You can sit down. We're in a series called "Quest for a King." We're on an adventure to learn the story of our whole world from the very beginning and get to know God, the one who made it all.

There's one really important thing we're talking about today, we call it our "Big Idea." Our Big Idea is super important for all of us to remember, so let's practice saying it together.



Big Idea Jingle



(Auto advance) Big Idea Slide: I can always trust God.

The Big Idea is, “I can always trust God.” Can you repeat that after me? The Big Idea. THE BIG IDEA. I can always, I CAN ALWAYS, trust God. TRUST GOD. Alright, now let’s say it all together!

Do This: Show Kid-Os the actions and have them practice the Big Idea with you three times. Use a different voice each time. **Voice ideas for this week: Running in place, astronaut, horse riding.**

Know This: These are the Big Idea actions: (Make a rainbow motion with your hands) The Big Idea. (Point to self) I can always, (clasp hands together in front of you) trust God.

Awesome job practicing our Big Idea! You can all sit down.

While we’re here today, listen very closely for our Big Idea Bell! Whenever you hear this sound it means we need to say our Big Idea.

You can say it and still do the actions while sitting in your spot. Let’s practice!

Bible Adventure

Trusting God is so important, I’m excited to learn more about how we can trust God every day. Next we get to learn about God by going on a Bible Adventure.



Bible Adventure Jingle

Do This: Show kids the Bible.

The Bible is the greatest book ever. The Bible is filled with stories from people who knew God and saw him do amazing things. Today, we get to hear a story about Abraham, someone who travelled a long, long way to follow God.

Do This: Get the Bible storybook out and sit down in the chair.

This story you are going to hear comes from the Bible, but we use this storybook because the pictures help us imagine what it might have looked like back when the Bible was written. The pictures you see in here are the same as the ones on the screen. Let's get started!

Do This: Have kids help you "turn" the pages on the screen with an exaggerated arm wave.



Picture 1: Abraham in a tent

Abraham loved God and wanted to follow him no matter what. One day, though, God asked Abraham to move from his home, and travel a long, long way. God made a promise that the whole world would be blessed by Abraham's family. That meant that Abraham's family would make the world a better place, because Abraham trusted God.



Picture 2: Abraham moves

God also promised to give Abraham a new place to live. Abraham probably felt afraid to move so far away, but he knew he could always trust God. Abraham and his family packed up everything they could and moved away from their home.



Picture 3: Abraham and Lot argue

Abraham didn't have an easy trip. His family didn't always get along, and some of the people they met weren't kind to them. No matter what happened, though, Abraham trusted God.



Picture 4: Abraham at home

One day, God led Abraham to a wonderful place to live. God gave Abraham a son named Isaac. Abraham trusted that God would always keep his promises. We can always trust God, just like Abraham did.

(Auto-advance) Memory Verse: Isaiah 9:2- The people who are now living in darkness will see a great light.

Our Memory Verses here in Kid-O-Deo come from the Bible.

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

Have you ever had to walk through a dark place, like a cave or a hallway at night? What you need is a flashlight or lamp to help you. This verse is saying God can lead us through life, like the greatest light of all. That's like how God led Abraham no matter what happened! Let's practice saying this verse together.

Do This: Practice the verse with the Kid-Os three times. You can start in your quiet/whisper voice and then get a little louder each time you practice.

Know This: The verse with actions goes like this: (Open your Bibles) Isaiah 9:2- (Hold your hands over your eyes) The people who are now living in darkness (hold your arms up in a Y position) will see a great light.
