BIBLE PASSAGE

Matthew 28:16-20

1. KNOW THE CONTEXT

The Books of Matthew is a collection of stories about the life and teachings of Jesus.

In this book Matthew shows us how important Jesus really is. He is God's Son come to live among he people He created and rescue us from our sins. Matthew also showcases Jesus as the greatest teacher of all time. His teachings stand as some of the most important lessons the world has ever seen.

In this passage, the disciples are seeing Jesus for the first time since He was crucified. Jesus has risen from the dead and they are seeing Him alive! Jesus is communicating a game plan for the disciples.

These words from Jesus are called "The Great Commission". This is what Jesus wants His disciples to do and what He wants all His followers to do.
