Lesson 1: On the Road

It's time to get this road trip started! Every journey is filled with ups and downs, and Elijah's was no different. Find out how God came through for Elijah, even when everything seemed lost.

Lesson 2: Mis-Guided

Do you ever wish you could see what God is doing? This week, we'll learn what Elisha knew long ago. God is working all around us, and sometimes to see it, we just need to pay attention.

Lesson 3: Good Times Ahead

If you heard someone say "I'm going to run a race in the next Olympics," what would you expect them to do? Eat cake for every meal? Sit on the couch all day? Of course not! Anyone who wants to do something amazing has to prepare. That's the message Joel wanted all of God's people to know: Don't wait to listen to God, start following Him today.

Lesson 4: Special Delivery

Have you heard the word "mercy"? It's what you call forgiving someone, even when you could get back at them. Long ago, the prophet Jonah saw how God's mercy can change lives. He also learned that we can be merciful, too, though it's not always easy.

Lesson 5: Strange Sights

People didn't want to listen to Amos much. Life was good, they had what they needed, what was the big deal? Amos, however, could see that people were headed the wrong way. This week, we'll find out why following God is important, however great life is!

Lesson 6: Wrong Turn

Hosea probably understood how amazing God's love is more than most of us do. God asked Hosea to do some difficult things and love some difficult people. This week, we'll see why loving someone, even when they're wrong, is one way we can change the world.

Lesson 7: Culture Shock

It's not always fun to stand out. The prophet Micah had to choose between doing what God said was right or doing the wrong things the people around him were doing. This week, we'll see how we can stand for what's right, like Micah did.

Lesson 8: Group Photo

Have you ever been hurt by a friend? Obadiah knows that feeling, too. He and the rest of the land of Israel were attacked, not just by an enemy but by their neighbors, people that were supposed to be

their allies. Obadiah has a message for those people, that can help us see how to be good friends, even today.

Lesson 9: Breakdown

Where are you, God? Nahum lived in a time when a lot of people were hurting and wondering if God was really there for them. This week, we'll find out where God is when we feel hurt and see how we can keep following him through the toughest times in life.

Lesson 10: Repairs Needed

Have you ever forgotten something important? In the days of Zephaniah and Huldah, God's people wanted to follow Him, but had almost forgotten how! We'll see how they were reminded and find out why following God is something every one of us should choose today.

Lesson 11: Bumpy Roads

Hearing "God's got a plan," sounds encouraging, but for Habakkuk, it was kind of scary. Bad things were happening, and God told Habakkuk that He wouldn't stop them. What do we do when we're following God, and bad things happen anyway? We'll talk about that, this week!

Lesson 12: Landmark

Is there something you've been putting off? In this week's story, God's people had returned to their homes, but weren't too worried about following God. They wanted to put it off, just a little longer. Haggai's message was simple: that will never work. Putting off following God is something none of us can afford to do.

Lesson 13: Interpreter Needed

In Zechariah's time, God's people were doing a lot of good things, but they had been forgetting one of the most important things God told them to do. We'll find out what that was, and how we can follow God in the same way today!

Lesson 14: A Great View

What's ahead? It might be a new school year, a new home, new friends, or just new challenges. Whatever it is, God is with you! This week, we'll meet with the prophet Malachi, and he'll remind us that wherever we are, we can be faithful to God.

That's a great problem to think about. What does God want me to do? That's what we get to talk about in group time!

Know This: Group time during the summer may either be done in groups, or if there are not enough leaders to break into groups, you may continue with this script as a large group.

Do This: If you are breaking into groups, direct the kids to where their group is meeting, using their grade's flag as a guide. Skip this section of the script. After ten minutes, continue with the "Get Moving Challenge" part of this Large Group script.

People have asked that question for a long, long, time. "What does God want me to do?"

Let me ask you another question. If you wanted to know what your parents wanted you to do, who would you ask? Your friend? Your dog? No! You'd ask your parents! So, if we want to know what God wants us to do, the best one to ask is- God!

Probably the best way to find out what God wants us to do is to read what He says in the Bible!

Do This: Show kids the Bible.



Bible Books Slide

The Bible looks like one big book, but it actually is a collection of books. It's sixty-six different books, written by a lot of different people. The first thirty-nine books are a history of the country of Israel. People from Israel saw God do amazing things and wrote them down. Those books are in the first part of our Bible and are called the "Old Testament." They were written a long time ago, but that's not really why they're called "Old." They're called "Old" now, because we have a New Testament now.

The last twenty-seven books of the Bible are called the "New" testament, because they are about how Jesus changed the entire world. They are books and letters by people who knew Jesus, walked with Him, and learned from Him. They saw Jesus die and come back to life.

The Old Testament is filled with God's promises for His people in Israel. We can learn so much about God through those stories. But Jesus' story in the New Testament, wasn't just for people a long time ago. Jesus' story was for you, and for me.



Series Title Slide: Road Trip

There's so much to learn about God. I can only tell you a little bit of it here at church. There are ways you can learn about God every day, though. One of the best ways to do that is reading the Bible.

There are some good things to know when you start reading the Bible, though. That's why I've got this!

Do This: Take out the giant Bible page. Place it on an easel.

Know This: The verses on the page will be Hebrews 1:1-2. The text reads- "In the past, God spoke to our people through the prophets. He spoke at many times. He spoke in different ways. But in these last days He has spoken to us through His Son."



Hebrews 1:1-2 (Image)

Here's a short section of our Bible. You'll notice a big number, that is a chapter number. The smaller numbers are called verses. The Bible wasn't written with those numbers, we added them later, so we could find things in the Bible easily.

I want to show you three things you can do that can make reading the Bible easier, and something to be excited about.



1. Get creative

First, get creative! If you have your own Bible, and your parents are ok with it, you could draw in your Bible. This helps us notice what's going on and stay focused on what the Bible is saying. Check this out. These verses might be a little confusing, but I wonder if we can make sense of them.

Do This: As you talk, mark the appropriate words on the giant page with a dry erase marker.

There are lots of words and names that mean "God" in the Bible. If you realize a word means God, you could draw a cloud around the word to remind you who it is talking about. In these verses, it can help us remember who "He" is.

Do This: Draw a cloud around the words that mean "God."

I like to draw an arrow under action words, to show that something is happening.

Do This: Draw an arrow under the action words- “spoke” and “spoken.”

People also use a lot of different words to mean “Jesus.” Words like “Lord, Savior, and Christ.” In this verse, Jesus is called “God’s Son.” Let’s draw a cross next to that to remind us that it means Jesus.

Do This: Draw a cross next to the words “His Son.”

There are more things you could do, like drawing an arrow pointing backward over “In the past.” That reminds us that it’s something that happened way before this was written. This writer uses the term “last days” to mean the time we’re living in right now.

So, what does this verse mean? Well, a long time ago, God spoke. He spoke through people called prophets. That was before, but He doesn’t do that anymore. Now, today, He speaks to us through His Son, who is- Jesus.

Drawing like this can help us figure out what parts of the Bible mean. The second thing to do is: explore their world.



1. Get creative
2. Explore their world

The people we read about in the Bible really lived, but they did live a long time ago. It can be tough for us to imagine what life was like for them. So, first, find a parent or an adult you trust to help, and then look up the places and people from the Bible! If you read about the cities of Jerusalem or Ephesus, you can look up pictures of what they might have looked like! If you read about the country of Samaria, you can look up a map of where it is.

The Bible is exciting, because it tells us the true story of our world. Through it, you can learn more about God every day! If you’re looking for a place to get started, we’ve got something for you.

Do This: Show kids the Bible reading plan.

This plan will help you get a good idea of what the Bible is about and learn a lot about God along the way! You can grab one as you leave today.

The ideas that Zephaniah and Huldah wrote about are so important. It's not enough for us to know what God wants us to do, we have to actually do it, too.

One thing they said really stuck out to me.



Big Idea Slide: Today is the day to follow God.

Today is the day to follow God. Earlier, we talked about how we can learn what following God looks like by reading the Bible. That's what the people in the time of Zephaniah and Huldah did, in a way. They read the books they had about God and learned what He wanted them to do.



Series Title Slide: Road Trip

There's one super important person we know today that they didn't back then, though. Today when we read the Bible, we get to know God's Son, Jesus. Two thousand years ago, God's Son Jesus came to live on earth, and told us exactly what we were made to do.



Matthew 22:36- "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul. Love Him with all your mind."

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

That seems important. We were created to know God and to love Him. But Jesus wasn't done. He had a second thing for us to do.



Matthew 22:36- "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul. Love Him with all your mind. And... Love your neighbor as you love yourself."

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

Jesus picked two things for us to do. Love God with everything we have, and love our neighbors, the people around us. When He said neighbors, Jesus didn't just mean the people that live next door to us. He meant every person we see, talk to, and are near each day. Can you think of any examples? Who are some "neighbors" you have?

Do This: Allow kids to answer.

Loving our neighbors isn't always easy. When Jesus first said this, people were surprised. They wanted a checklist of things to do to make God happy, but instead, Jesus said that the way we love God is like the way we love the people around us.

In other words, I can tell how much I love God by the way I treat the people God made. If you're wondering, God made every person on earth.

Why is this such a big deal? I think I can show you.

Do This: Take out a stuffed dog.



Series Title Slide: Road Trip

Can I get a volunteer to help me out?

Do This: Select a kid and bring them up on stage.

Now, all you have to do is imagine with me. This is your dog. You love this dog. You could even name it. Can you think of a name?

Do This: Allow the kid to say a name. If they can't think of one, you could just name it Chew-bark-a.

Great. This is a special dog. Imagine, though, that a friend of yours saw your dog and laughed at it. They started to make fun of it, and your dog began to seem sad. Would you be ok with that?

Probably not. They don't stop there, though. Imagine they're angry at your dog, and yell at it, scaring it. How would you feel?

Do This: Allow the kid to answer.

You'd probably feel upset at them for the way they're treating your dog. What if they did something that hurt your dog?

Of course, you'd be super angry! I'd bet, even if they were super nice to you, or tried to get you nice gifts to make up for it, you'd still be upset that they hurt your dog.

What if someone is nice to your dog, though? They are happy to see it, give it a treat, and show that they love it? How do you feel about them?

Do This: Allow the kid to answer.

You'd probably like them a lot! If someone is nice to the ones you love, you'll probably like them a lot.

Thank you for helping, you can sit back down.

What was the point of all this? Well, if someone loves your dog, you probably like them a lot. If someone is unkind to your dog, though, you've got a problem with them. Why? Because you love your dog!

Remember what Jesus said? He wanted us to love God and love the people around us. Why? Because God loves them. He loves every person, because He made every person. Think about that. We will never meet a person that God doesn't love. That means if we say we love God, we have to love others.

We want people to love the ones we care about, even down to our pets. Just like that, God's not ok with us hurting, making fun of, or being unkind to the people He made and loves. When we love others, though, God is overjoyed!

Jesus gave us the best example ever of how to love others, and we can learn about Him in the New Testament, the second part of the Bible. You already know a lot about how to love others, though. We know that being mean, unkind, or hurtful isn't loving. We know that helping, standing up for others, and giving to them are great ways to share love.
