Lesson 1: On the Road

It's time to get this road trip started! Every journey is filled with ups and downs, and Elijah's was no different. Find out how God came through for Elijah, even when everything seemed lost.

Lesson 2: Mis-Guided

Do you ever wish you could see what God is doing? This week, we'll learn what Elisha knew long ago. God is working all around us, and sometimes to see it, we just need to pay attention.

Lesson 3: Good Times Ahead

If you heard someone say "I'm going to run a race in the next Olympics," what would you expect them to do? Eat cake for every meal? Sit on the couch all day? Of course not! Anyone who wants to do something amazing has to prepare. That's the message Joel wanted all of God's people to know: Don't wait to listen to God, start following Him today.

Lesson 4: Special Delivery

Have you heard the word "mercy"? It's what you call forgiving someone, even when you could get back at them. Long ago, the prophet Jonah saw how God's mercy can change lives. He also learned that we can be merciful, too, though it's not always easy.

Lesson 5: Strange Sights

People didn't want to listen to Amos much. Life was good, they had what they needed, what was the big deal? Amos, however, could see that people were headed the wrong way. This week, we'll find out why following God is important, however great life is!

Lesson 6: Wrong Turn

Hosea probably understood how amazing God's love is more than most of us do. God asked Hosea to do some difficult things and love some difficult people. This week, we'll see why loving someone, even when they're wrong, is one way we can change the world.

Lesson 7: Culture Shock

It's not always fun to stand out. The prophet Micah had to choose between doing what God said was right or doing the wrong things the people around him were doing. This week, we'll see how we can stand for what's right, like Micah did.

Lesson 8: Group Photo

Have you ever been hurt by a friend? Obadiah knows that feeling, too. He and the rest of the land of Israel were attacked, not just by an enemy but by their neighbors, people that were supposed to be

their allies. Obadiah has a message for those people, that can help us see how to be good friends, even today.

Lesson 9: Breakdown

Where are you, God? Nahum lived in a time when a lot of people were hurting and wondering if God was really there for them. This week, we'll find out where God is when we feel hurt and see how we can keep following him through the toughest times in life.

Lesson 10: Repairs Needed

Have you ever forgotten something important? In the days of Zephaniah and Huldah, God's people wanted to follow Him, but had almost forgotten how! We'll see how they were reminded and find out why following God is something every one of us should choose today.

Lesson 11: Bumpy Roads

Hearing "God's got a plan," sounds encouraging, but for Habakkuk, it was kind of scary. Bad things were happening, and God told Habakkuk that He wouldn't stop them. What do we do when we're following God, and bad things happen anyway? We'll talk about that, this week!

Lesson 12: Landmark

Is there something you've been putting off? In this week's story, God's people had returned to their homes, but weren't too worried about following God. They wanted to put it off, just a little longer. Haggai's message was simple: that will never work. Putting off following God is something none of us can afford to do.

Lesson 13: Interpreter Needed

In Zechariah's time, God's people were doing a lot of good things, but they had been forgetting one of the most important things God told them to do. We'll find out what that was, and how we can follow God in the same way today!

Lesson 14: A Great View

What's ahead? It might be a new school year, a new home, new friends, or just new challenges. Whatever it is, God is with you! This week, we'll meet with the prophet Malachi, and he'll remind us that wherever we are, we can be faithful to God.

Game Title Slide: "Strange Sights."



 Know This: Group time during the summer may either be done in groups, or if there are not enough leaders to break into groups, you may continue with this script as a large group. Do This: If you are breaking into groups, direct the kids to where their group is meeting, using their grade's flag as a guide. Skip this section of the script. After ten minutes, continue with the "Get Moving Challenge" part of this Large Group script. Let's start group time by asking a couple questions.

What's something you have that's important to you? It could be a toy, like Josh's, or something else you have. Turn to someone next to you and talk about that!

Do This: Allow kids to talk for 20 seconds or so.



Josh is trying to do everything right, but I think he's forgetting something important. Did you notice anything Josh is doing that doesn't seem right?

Do This: Allow a couple kids to answer.

He isn't being very kind to Beka. He's trying so hard to be perfect, he's forgetting to care about his sister.

Josh might be doing good things, but none of them are as important as just being kind. Sometimes, we focus on doing good things, instead of the thing that's most important. I can think of another example of that, too. Imagine your room is super messy.



One day, your parents ask you to clean your room. It's really messy, though, so instead, you go and read a book. When your parents see your room, how will they probably feel?

Do This: Allow a kid to answer.

They'll be upset! Ok, second try. They ask you to clean your room again, but you still don't want to, so instead you make a really nice card telling them how awesome of a parent they are. You give them the card, but they also look at your room, and it's still messy. How will your parents probably feel?

Do This: Allow a kid to answer.

They'll be upset! Ok, one more chance. Your parents say to clean your room. You have one more idea of a way to get out of it, though. You go and do the dishes instead. Is that listening to what your parents say? No! How do you think they'll feel?

Do This: Allow a kid to answer.

They'd be upset! You didn't listen three times. It didn't really matter what else you were doing, even if it was good, you still didn't do what they said. What would you have done if you really listened to them?

Do This: Allow the kids to answer.

You'd have cleaned your room! Now, think about this. Are your parents upset because the things you did, reading a book, doing the dishes, and making a card, are bad things? No! Those are all good things, so why are they upset?

Do This: Allow a kid to answer.

They're upset because you didn't listen, and didn't do the first, most important thing they wanted you to do: clean your room! That seems so obvious, but we do something like that with God sometimes.

Series Title Slide: Road Trip

The Bible has a lot to say about following God. Here's something a man named John wrote down about following God.

1 John 3:23- "God has commanded us to believe in the name of His Son, Jesus Christ. He has also commanded us to love one another."

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

Here, John writes about just two things that God wants us to do. There aren't a million, not even a thousand. He just writes about two. The first one is to believe in God's Son Jesus. John means is that God wants every one of us to follow Jesus and trust Him. If you haven't made that decision yet, any of the adults in here would love to tell you more about that amazing choice you can make.

I want to really focus on the second thing John writes about, though. God also says to love one another. Loving other people matters so much to God, it's one of the only two things He tells us we need to do. So many times, though, we focus on other things first. We say: "I'll pray and read my Bible more, that's what following God is all about." Or "I go to church and try to do the right things. That's what following God is about." Those are awesome things to do, but God says loving others is even more important.

Series Title Slide: Road Trip

In our example, your parents just wanted you to clean up your room. They didn't want you to do all those other things. It didn't matter what else you did if you didn't listen to their first instruction.

One of the things God cares about the most is how we treat other people. Many of the other things we do, singing songs, coming to church, are great, but if we don't love others, we're missing what God says is the most important way to follow Him.

Showing love might not look exactly the same for all of us. God might be asking you trust Him with a friendship that is really tough right now. Or, He might be asking you to trust Him with something that's going on in your family.

Do This: Read the options from the screen.	

Which one would you want someone on the other team to do? Joking about them probably wouldn't help, and letting them score isn't a great idea, either. It can make a game not fun if both teams don't try their best.

It can be super helpful to congratulate them or even just say "Good job" if they score or do something else well. You can even talk about something they did really well after the game is done. Showing love can make playing even more fun for everyone.

Let's look at another example.

A couple other kids are being mean to you. They make fun of things about you, or things you wear. If you ask them about it, or tell them to stop, they say it's no big deal, or that they're just joking, but you still feel hurt.

How could we show love here? What those kids are doing isn't right, but God tells us to treat others the way we want to be treated. So let's see some choices we could make.


Do This: Read the options from the screen.

Which one should we do? Which one would you want someone to do for you?

Do This: Allow a kid to answer.

You wouldn't want someone to do that to you, so why would you do that to them? You wouldn't want someone to just quit being friends with you, either. If they won't stop being mean, it might be time to keep away from them, but just quitting being their friend probably won't help.

Both C and D are good answers. It might take a risk, but we can show them love by talking to them about how we feel. They might not know what they're saying is hurting us. Instead of being mean back, we can choose to be kind, even if they might not be kind to us. You might make them re-think the way they're acting, or you might realize that they're not going to change, and you need to stop hanging out with them.



Showing love to others isn't always easy, and if someone is being unkind to you, you should also talk about it to an adult you trust. If you need someone to talk to, let me or one of the other leaders here know, we'd love to listen to you, and help however we can. In fact, let's talk to God together right now.

God, thank you for always being there for us. Help us to follow you and show love to others. Help us to trust you when we fail, when we are hurt, and when we succeed. Amen.
