

Group Time Guide

Supplies Needed: Power Pictures

1. Introductions and Snack

Circle Up: Have each Kid-O give you a high five and then sit down in a circle.

Encourage each Kid-O to say their name as you give them hand sanitizer.

Do This: Give kids hand sanitizer, then hand each of them a snack.

2. Discussion Questions

- What are some people or things that seem powerful?
- In our Bible Adventure, how did God show that He is powerful? (He saved Elisha from Aram's army by making them blind for a while.)

3. Hands-On Option

Do This: Show Kid-Os pictures of things we often think of as being powerful. Have kids tell you what the picture is and talk about why those things seem powerful (they are loud, strong, can do things we can't, etc.). Reiterate that, yes, the (lion, bulldozer, weight lifter, rhinoceros, and power tools) are powerful in some ways, but God is way more powerful than anything we can ever imagine!

The Point: God is the most powerful of all!

4. Big Idea, Memory Verse, Stickers, and Prayer

Do This: Practice the Big Idea and Memory Verse with the kids.

Memory Verse: Habakkuk 3:18 - I will still be glad because of what the Lord has done.

Big Idea: God is powerful.

Do This: Give each kid a sticker. Encourage them to talk about what they learned with their grown-ups.

Do This: Pray! "Dear God, we love you. Thank you for loving us. Help us remember that you are powerful. Amen."
