Supplies Needed: Planner page.

1. Discussion Questions

- What do you think "Faithfulness" means? (Doing what you say you'll do.)
- Can you think of an example of faithfulness? (One example is the Old Faithful geyser- faithfully erupts every 90 minutes.)

2. Hands-On Option

Look Up and Read: Hebrews 10:23. This verse is about the hope we can have because God is always faithful.

Say This: This verse tells us two things. First, God is always faithful. He always keeps His promises and does what He says He'll do. Second, when things are changing around us, when life is crazy, we have something we can hold firmly to. It's the hope God gives us. He is faithful to us, so we can always be faithful to Him.

Every one of us is going to have a different year. Different schools, different sports, different families, friends, and more different things than I can even say. We can all be faithful to God, though, wherever we are, and whatever we're doing.

Do This: Fill out the planner page for the kids. Choose something they might be doing this year, a sport, class, or even just being part of their family. Then, answer the questions on the page- 1. What do you want this to be like? (You probably want to enjoy this, and for the team or other group you're with to do well.) 2. What can you do to make those things happen? (Some examples are: Have a good attitude, encourage others.) 3. How could we be faithful to God while doing this? (Being fair, loving others, having a good attitude whether we win or lose.)

The Point: We can be faithful to God, because He is always faithful to us. You can fill out these pages for new classes, new friendships, anything that you are doing or going through this year. You'll get these as you leave today, I want to challenge you to fill at least one out this week.

Wrap-Up and Prayer

Ask: What's something you're excited about right now? What's something you would like God's help with?

Do This: Pray with the kids. If they've mentioned things that would be good to talk to God about, you can mention them in your prayer.
