About this Series:

What was it like to be there for the very first Christmas, the day Jesus was born? In this series, we'll hear the stories of people that God told about Jesus long before he came, and the stories of people who were there when he was born.

Series at a Glance for Kid-O-Deo (continued)

Lesson 1: The Promise and the Plan

Right from the beginning, God has had an amazing plan! All the way back in the first book of the Bible, God shows people that someone is coming who can save them and show them his love. That person is Jesus!

Lesson 2: Isaiah

Isaiah knew God had made some amazing promises, but they were probably really hard for him to trust. It seemed like everything was going wrong! Then, God told Isaiah about his amazing plan, the plan to send Jesus, and reminded him that we can always trust God's promises.

Lesson 3: Zechariah and Elizabeth

God told Zechariah and Elizabeth that he had a plan that neither of them expected. This week, we'll see how Zechariah learned that doing what God says is right is always the best choice, even if it seems unexpected.

Lesson 4: Wise Men

The wise men traveled a long, long way, all to see Jesus! They brought him gifts, like they would for a king. They knew that Jesus wasn't just another person, he was God's Son!

Lesson 5: Shepherds

When the shepherds learned that God's Son Jesus had been born, they ran to see him right away. Then, they wanted to share that joy they felt with everyone! This week, we'll learn how we can share joy and tell others about Jesus, too!

Lesson 6: Mary and Joseph

When Jesus was born, his parents' lives were changed forever. They had to move to a new home, and there were a lot of things they could have been afraid of. Through it all, though, they learned about the amazing peace that God can give us, even when life is tough.

Lesson 7: Jesus

We celebrate Christmas because of one person: Jesus! When He was born, the world was changed forever. This week we'll hear the story of Jesus and learn how we can follow him today.

Introduction and Rules

Welcome everyone! My name is _____, and I'm so glad to see each and every one of you. During our time together, we'll get to sing a couple fun songs, learn a memory verse, and hear an awesome story. Before we do any of that, there are three important things for you to remember. They're our three Kid-O-Deo rules!

Know This: This is a great opportunity to set the tone and expectations for your time together. Kids like to know what's expected of them too—it helps them feel safe and secure. You can make this section informative, helpful, and fun all at the same time!

Rule #1: When I'm talking you are listening!

Let's put on our listening ears and turn them way up! We'll also turn our voices way down, so that we can all listen super well.

Rule #2: Keep your hands and feet to yourself!

We want this to be a great place for all you leaders and Kid-Os, which means no poking, kicking, or bugging your neighbor. A good way to remember this rule is to: do a little clap and place your hands in your lap!

Rule #3: Stay in your spot!

You have a spot of your very own here in Kid-O-Deo, and it's right where you are sitting! It's important for us to stay in our spots, so that everyone can pay attention and have fun!

Big Idea

I love singing with you, Kid-Os! You can sit down. We're in a series today called "Stories of Christmas." In this series, we'll hear the stories of people that God told about Jesus long before he came, and the stories of people who were there when he was born.

We're learning a super important idea today. We call it our "Big Idea." Let's get ready to practice saying today's big idea together!



Big Idea Jingle



(Auto advance) Big Idea Slide: I can believe God's promises.

Today's Big Idea is, "I can believe God's promises." Can you repeat that after me? The Big Idea. THE BIG IDEA. I can believe, I CAN BELIEVE, God's promises. GOD'S PROMISES.

Do This: Show Kid-Os the actions and have them practice the Big Idea with you three times. You can have them repeat it after you each time. Voice ideas: Singing, Whispering, Jumping.
Know This: These are the Big Idea actions: (Place your hands in front of your face, palms out, then move them down in a rainbow motion) The Big Idea. (Point to self) I can believe (Point up) God's promises.

Awesome job practicing our Big Idea! You can all sit down.

That Big Idea is so important, we're going to say it several times today. Since this series is all about stories, whenever you see this book on the screen, that means it's time to say our Big Idea!

You can say it and still do the actions in your spot. Let's practice!

Bible Adventure

Next we get to learn more by going on a Bible Adventure.



Bible Adventure Jingle

Do This: Show kids the Bible.

The Bible is the greatest book ever. It's filled with things that God wants us to know! It has many true stories about people who loved God, and about things God has done. Today, we get to read about someone who wrote part of our Bible. He lived a long time ago, long before Jesus was even born, but God told him Jesus was on the way.

Do This: Get the Bible storybook out and sit down in the chair.

This story you are going to hear comes from the Bible, but we use this storybook because the pictures help us imagine what it might have looked like back when the Bible was written. The pictures you see in here are the same as the ones on the screen. Let's get started!

Do This: Have kids help you “turn” the pages on the screen with an exaggerated arm wave.



Picture 1: Isaiah

Isaiah was a prophet. That meant his job was to listen to God and write down the things God told him. Sometimes, God even told Isaiah about things that hadn’t happened yet. Isaiah wrote all of these things down.



Picture 2: Sad people in broken down city

Isaiah had seen some terrible things. He had seen kings be unkind to the people they ruled. He saw people hurt others and steal from them. Some people wondered if God really cared about them. Then one day, God gave Isaiah a special message.



Picture 3: The Nativity

God told Isaiah that one day, someone would come who would save everyone. He would bring hope, joy, love, and peace. He would teach people about God and show them how much He loves them. That person was Jesus!



Picture 4: Isaiah writing

God gave Isaiah an amazing promise. That meant Isaiah had to trust that God would keep his promise. Isaiah knew that the most important thing he could do was trust God’s plan. He believed God’s promise, even though it was difficult. He wrote down everything God said, so people could watch for the one who would save them, the one God promised was coming.

Great listening, Kid-Os! We can always trust God’s promises. When God says he will do something, or tells us what the wise choice to make is, we can always believe him.

(Auto-advance) Memory Verse: Luke 2:10-11 "I bring you good news. It will bring great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you. He is the Messiah, the Lord."

Our Memory Verses come from the Bible. This is a verse about the day Jesus was born!

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

Jesus was the one God promised would come, the one he told Isaiah about. It was always God's plan to send Jesus to save us. Let's practice saying this verse together!

Do This: Practice the verse with the Kid-Os three times. You can start in your quiet/whisper voice and then get a little louder each time you practice.

Know This: The verse with actions goes like this: (Open your Bibles) Luke 2:10-11. (Cup hands around mouth) I bring you good news. (Point to smile) It will bring great joy for all the people. (Point outward) Today in the town of David (cradle motion) a Savior has been born to you. (Put hands like a crown on your head) He is the Messiah, the Lord.
