Series at a Glance for Kid-O-Deo (continued)

Lesson 1: The Promise and the Plan

Right from the beginning, God has had an amazing plan! All the way back in the first book of the Bible, God shows people that someone is coming who can save them and show them his love. That person is Jesus!

Lesson 2: Isaiah

Isaiah knew God had made some amazing promises, but they were probably really hard for him to trust. It seemed like everything was going wrong! Then, God told Isaiah about his amazing plan, the plan to send Jesus, and reminded him that we can always trust God's promises.

Lesson 3: Zechariah and Elizabeth

God told Zechariah and Elizabeth that he had a plan that neither of them expected. This week, we'll see how Zechariah learned that doing what God says is right is always the best choice, even if it seems unexpected.

Lesson 4: Wise Men

The wise men traveled a long, long way, all to see Jesus! They brought him gifts, like they would for a king. They knew that Jesus wasn't just another person, he was God's Son!

Lesson 5: Shepherds

When the shepherds learned that God's Son Jesus had been born, they ran to see him right away. Then, they wanted to share that joy they felt with everyone! This week, we'll learn how we can share joy and tell others about Jesus, too!

Lesson 6: Mary and Joseph

When Jesus was born, his parents' lives were changed forever. They had to move to a new home, and there were a lot of things they could have been afraid of. Through it all, though, they learned about the amazing peace that God can give us, even when life is tough.

Lesson 7: Jesus

We celebrate Christmas because of one person: Jesus! When He was born, the world was changed forever. This week we'll hear the story of Jesus and learn how we can follow him today.

Rule #3: Stay in your spot!

You have a spot of your very own here in Kid-O-Deo, and it's right where you are sitting! It's important for us to stay in our spots, so that everyone can pay attention and have fun!


Song 1: It's Christmastime

Big Idea 2:00

I love singing with you, Kid-Os! You can sit down. We're in a series today called "Stories of Christmas." In this series, we'll hear the stories of people that God told about Jesus long before he came, and the stories of people who were there when he was born.

We're learning a super important idea today. We call it our "Big Idea." Let's get ready to practice saying today's big idea together!



Today's Big Idea is, "I can share joy." Can you repeat that after me? The Big Idea. THE BIG IDEA. I can trust God, I CAN TRUST GOD, when I don't get, WHEN I DON'T GET, my way. MY WAY.

Do This: Show Kid-Os the actions and have them practice the Big Idea with you three times. You can have them repeat it after you each time. Voice ideas: Bumpy camel ride, loud trumpet, quiet shushing.

Know This: These are the Big Idea actions: (Place your hands in front of your face, palms out, then move them down in a rainbow motion) The Big Idea. (Point up) I can trust God, (shake head) when I don't get (point to self) my way.

Awesome job practicing our Big Idea! You can all sit down.

That Big Idea is so important, we're going to say it several times today. Since this series is all about stories, whenever you see this book on the screen, that means it's time to say our Big Idea!

Do This: Show kids the Bible.

The Bible is the greatest book ever. It's filled with things that God wants us to know! It has many true stories about people who loved God, and about things God has done. Today, we get to read about Mary and Joseph, the human parents of Jesus.

Do This: Get the Bible storybook out and sit down in the chair.

This story you are going to hear comes from the Bible, but we use this storybook because the pictures help us imagine what it might have looked like back when the

Bible was written. The pictures you see in here are the same as the ones on the screen. Let's get started!

Do This: Have kids help you "turn" the pages on the screen with an exaggerated arm wave.



Picture 1: Mary and angel

One day, a woman named Mary was at home, when suddenly an angel appeared! She was very afraid, but the angel said not to fear. God had chosen Mary to be the mother of his Son, Jesus. Mary was nervous, but said she would trust God, no matter what.



Picture 2: Joseph and angel

Joseph was engaged to Mary. He learned she was going to have a baby and wasn't sure what to do or think. Then, an angel appeared to him, too! The angel explained that this was all God's plan. This wasn't what Joseph expected, but he decided to trust God, just like Mary did.



Picture 3: Mary and Joseph traveling

When Jesus was close to being born, suddenly the ruler of the land said everyone had to travel back to the towns their families were from. For Mary and Joseph, this meant going a long way to the town of Bethlehem. When they were there, far from home, Jesus was born!




Picture 4: Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem

There was no room for Mary and Joseph to sleep inside, though. They had to stay in a stable with animals all around them. Mary and Joseph had to keep trusting God's plan, even after Jesus was born. One day they learned that a king named Herod wanted to find Jesus and kill him. Mary, Joseph, and Jesus ran away, and they even had to live in another country!
