Lesson 1: The Armor of God

There are things in life that try to pull us away from God and the way he wants us to live. That's why God gives each one of us special armor we can put on each day. This week, we'll learn how this armor can make us strong and brave.

Lesson 2: The Belt of Truth

The Belt of Truth reminds us how important it is to know the difference between lies and God's truth. This week, we'll learn how Joshua and Caleb believed what God said was true, even when no one else did.

Lesson 3: The Armor of Godliness

The Armor of Godliness helps us remember that we can do the things God says are right. This week, we'll hear the story of Daniel and the difficult choice he had to make.

Lesson 4: The Helmet of Salvation

The Helmet of Salvation reminds us that God has saved us, forgiven us, and nothing can separate us from his love. This week, we'll hear about God's plan to save us and how all of us can choose to follow Jesus.

Lesson 5: The Good News Shoes

The Good News Shoes remind us to go and tell others the good news about Jesus. This week, we'll hear the story of Paul and how he traveled around the world telling everyone he could about Jesus.

Lesson 6: The Shield of Faith

The Shield of Faith reminds us that trusting God and believing his promises is so important. Just like a shield can protect someone in battle, trusting God can protect us when life gets difficult. This week, we'll hear how Gideon had faith in God as he went into a battle.

Lesson 7: The Sword of the Spirit

The Sword of the Spirit reminds us that God's word is powerful, just like a sword. We can know God's word by reading the Bible. This week, we'll hear the story of Jesus in the desert and how he used God's true words from the Bible when he was tempted to believe lies.

Lesson 8: Prayer

After Paul writes about the Armor of God, he talks about the importance of prayer. God hears our prayers, and we can talk to anytime and anywhere. This week, we'll hear the story of the church praying for Peter after he was thrown in jail.

Introduction and Rules

Rule #3: Stay in your spot!

You have a spot of your very own here in Kid-O-Deo, and it's right where you are sitting! It's important for us to stay in our spots, so that everyone can pay attention and have fun!

Big Idea 2:00

I love singing with you, Kid-Os! You can sit down. We are in a series called "Strong and Brave." Have you ever wanted to be strong and brave like a superhero? When superheroes go on a mission, they wear special gear to help them and protect them. God made all of us to be heroes, too, and he gives us everything we need to be ready for each day. In this series, we'll learn how we can be strong and brave with The Armor of God.

Today, we're going to be learning about the 'Armor of Godliness. Let's all pretend we're putting on our superhero armor to protect our heart.

Do This: Cross arms over your upper body, pretending to put armor over your heart.

Rocky's wearing it, too!

The 'Armor of Godliness' reminds us that knowing the difference between right and wrong can protect our hearts from wrong choices. We can choose to obey God and do the things he says are right.

Now it's time to practice our "Big Idea." That's the super important thing we're learning about today!



Big Idea Jingle



(Auto advance) Big Idea Slide: I can do what God says is right.

The Big Idea is, "I can do what God says is right." Let's stand up and practice the big idea. I'll say a part first and you can repeat after me. I can do, I CAN DO. What God says, WHAT GOD SAYS. Is right, IS RIGHT. Great job! Alright, now let's say it all together!

Do This: Show Kid-Os the actions and have them practice the Big Idea with you three times. Use a different voice each time. **Voice ideas for this week: meowing cat, bouncing bunny, swimming.**

Know This: These are the Big Idea actions: (Place your hands in front of your face, palms out, then move them down in a rainbow motion) The Big Idea. (Point at self) I can do, (cup hands around mouth) what God says (put thumbs up) is right.

Awesome job practicing our Big Idea! You can all sit down.

That Big Idea is so important, we're going to say it several times today. Whenever you hear this superhero sound, it's time to say our big idea!

You can say it and still do the actions while sitting in your spot. Let's practice!

Next, we get to learn more about the Armor of Godliness by going on a Bible Adventure.



Bible Adventure Jingle

Do This: Show kids the Bible.

The Bible is the greatest book ever. It's full of words from God, and there are lots of true stories about people who loved God in the Bible, too! Today, we get to hear a story about someone who had to make a very difficult choice between right and wrong.

Do This: Get the Bible storybook out and sit down in the chair.

This story you are going to hear comes from the Bible, but we use this storybook because the pictures help us imagine what it might have looked like back when the Bible was written. The pictures you see in here are the same as the ones on the screen. Let's get started!

Do This: Have kids help you "turn" the pages on the screen with an exaggerated arm wave.



Picture 1: The king making Daniel a leader.

Daniel was a man who loved and followed God. When he was very young, he was taken away from his home to live in a faraway land called Babylon (Bab-i-lon). As Daniel got older, God gave him special wisdom and the ability to understand dreams. Daniel became such a great leader that the king decided to put him in charge of all the other leaders in the entire kingdom!

When the other leaders heard about this, they were jealous and wanted to stop the king from putting Daniel in charge. The leaders spied on Daniel and tried to find something that Daniel did wrong, but they couldn't find anything. Daniel could always be trusted to do what was right. So, the leaders decided to come up with a

sneaky plan. They saw that Daniel loved God and prayed to him three times every day. "Let's come up with a new law that will get Daniel in trouble!", the leaders said.

The leaders ran to the king and said to him, "Let's make a new law where no one is allowed to pray to anyone, except to you, oh wonderful King. If people don't follow this law, they should be thrown into the lion's den!" The king thought this sounded like a good idea, so he agreed and a law was made. When Daniel heard about the law, he knew it was wrong to pray to anyone except to God. What should Daniel do?

Daniel decided to do what God said was right, even if it meant being thrown into the lion's den. So, he went into his room and prayed to God, just like he had always done. The other leaders ran and told the king, "Daniel's not obeying your law!" The king was sad, because he really liked Daniel and he felt like the leaders had tricked him. But the law could not be changed, so Daniel was arrested and thrown into a den full of hungry lions. "May your God rescue you, Daniel!", the king said.

The next morning, the king ran to check on Daniel and found that he was alive and safe! "Did your God rescue you?", the king asked. "Yes!", Daniel replied. "God sent an angel to close the mouths of the lions so they wouldn't hurt me!" As Daniel was lifted out of the den, he didn't even have a scratch on him. Then, the king sent a message to the whole kingdom telling them to trust in Daniel's God, the one who rescues his people.

Know This: The verse with actions goes like this: (Open your Bibles) Ephesians 6:10. (Point up) "Finally, let the Lord (flex muscles) make you strong. (Point up) Depend on His (Hands on hips) mighty power."

See you later, Kristen. The Armor of Godliness can help us remember to do the things God says are right. God will give us the strength to make right choices.




