About this Series:

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Series at a Glance for Kid-O-Deo (continued)

Lesson 1: The Armor of God

There are things in life that try to pull us away from God and the way he wants us to live. That's why God gives each one of us special armor we can put on each day. This week, we'll learn how this armor can make us strong and brave.

Lesson 2: The Belt of Truth

The Belt of Truth reminds us how important it is to know the difference between lies and God's truth. This week, we'll learn how Joshua and Caleb believed what God said was true, even when no one else did.

Lesson 3: The Armor of Godliness

The Armor of Godliness helps us remember that we can do the things God says are right. This week, we'll hear the story of Daniel and the difficult choice he had to make.

Lesson 4: The Helmet of Salvation

The Helmet of Salvation reminds us that God has saved us, forgiven us, and nothing can separate us from his love. This week, we'll hear about God's plan to save us and how all of us can choose to follow Jesus.

Lesson 5: The Good News Shoes

The Good News Shoes remind us to go and tell others the good news about Jesus. This week, we'll hear the story of Paul and how he traveled around the world telling everyone he could about Jesus.

Lesson 6: The Shield of Faith

The Shield of Faith reminds us that trusting God and believing his promises is so important. Just like a shield can protect someone in battle, trusting God can protect us when life gets difficult. This week, we'll hear how Gideon had faith in God as he went into a battle.

Lesson 7: The Sword of the Spirit

The Sword of the Spirit reminds us that God's word is powerful, just like a sword. We can know God's word by reading the Bible. This week, we'll hear the story of Jesus in the desert and how he used God's true words from the Bible when he was tempted to believe lies.

Lesson 8: Prayer

After Paul writes about the Armor of God, he talks about the importance of prayer. God hears our prayers, and we can talk to anytime and anywhere. This week, we'll hear the story of the church praying for Peter after he was thrown in jail.

Big Idea 2:00

I love singing with you, Kid-Os! You can sit down. We are in a series called "Strong and Brave." Have you ever wanted to be strong and brave like a superhero? When superheroes go on a mission, they wear special gear to help them and protect them. God made all of us to be heroes, too, and he gives us everything we need to be ready for each day. In this series, we'll learn how we can be strong and brave with The Armor of God.

Today, we're going to be learning about the 'Sword of the Spirit'. Let's all pretend to hold up our superhero sword.

Do This: Pretend to hold up a sword.

Rocky has a sword with him today, too!

Soldiers in Bible times used a sword when they were fighting against their enemies. As followers of Jesus, we have an enemy, too. It's the same one that tried to get Adam and Eve to believe a lie about God. The Sword of the Spirit that Paul talks about is God's Word in the Bible. Knowing what God says in the Bible will help us to know what is true so we won't be tempted to believe lies.

Now it's time to practice our "Big Idea." That's the super important thing we're learning about today!



Big Idea Jingle



(Auto advance) Big Idea Slide: God's words in the Bible are powerful and true.

The Big Idea is, "God's words in the Bible are powerful and true." Let's stand up and practice the big idea. I'll say a part first and you can repeat after me. God's words in the Bible, GOD'S WORDS IN THE BIBLE. Are powerful and true, ARE POWERFUL AND TRUE. Great job! Alright, now let's say it all together!

Do This: Show Kid-Os the actions and have them practice the Big Idea with you three times. Use a different voice each time. **Voice ideas for this week: Underwater, fierce dinosaur, slow turtle**

Know This: These are the Big Idea actions: (Place your hands in front of your face, palms out, then move them down in a rainbow motion) The Big Idea. (Open hands like a Bible) God's words from the Bible, (Flex arm muscles) are powerful and true.

Awesome job practicing our Big Idea! You can all sit down.

That Big Idea is so important, we're going to say it several times today. Whenever you hear this superhero sound, it's time to say our big idea!

You can say it and still do the actions while sitting in your spot. Let's practice!

Next, we get to learn more about the Armor of God by going on a Bible Adventure.



Bible Adventure Jingle

Do This: Show kids the Bible.

The Bible is the greatest book ever. It's full of words from God, and there are lots of true stories about people who loved God in the Bible, too! Today, we get to hear a story about a time when Jesus was tempted to do something wrong.

Do This: Get the Bible storybook out and sit down in the chair.

This story you are going to hear comes from the Bible, but we use this storybook because the pictures help us imagine what it might have looked like back when the Bible was written. The pictures you see in here are the same as the ones on the screen. Let's get started!

Do This: Have kids help you "turn" the pages on the screen with an exaggerated arm wave.





Picture 1: Jesus being baptized.

Jesus had grown up and was now thirty years old. He had just been baptized and was ready to begin telling other people all about God's love for them. But first, Jesus went into the desert to spend some time alone. He spent forty days in the desert without eating and he became very hungry.





Picture 2: Jesus in the desert with the enemy.

While Jesus was alone in the desert, God's enemy came to find him. This is the same enemy that lied to Adam and Eve when they were in the garden. The enemy tried to tempt Jesus and tell him lies, because he didn't want Jesus to rescue God's people. "If you are really God's Son, prove it to me by doing what I tell you to do!", the enemy said.



Picture 3: Jesus in the desert and Bible

Each time that Jesus was tempted, he would say a verse from the Bible. Jesus used God's words from the Bible to fight against the temptation, because God's word is powerful. The enemy felt like he was losing the battle, so he decided to tell one final lie to Jesus.



Picture 4: Jesus looking out over all the kingdoms

He showed Jesus all the kingdoms in the world and said they could belong to him. All Jesus needed to do was worship the enemy instead of God. Jesus didn't fall for that trick. He used God's words from the Bible and said, "Get away from me! It is written in the Bible 'Only worship God. God is the only one you should serve.'" Then, the enemy left Jesus. Jesus had won the battle against him by saying God's truth from the Bible.

Our Memory Verse comes from the Bible. This verse comes right before Paul writes about the Armor of God. It reminds us that God is the one who can make us strong and brave.

Do This: Read the verse from the screen.

Knowing what God says in the Bible can help make us strong because God's words are very powerful.

Do This: Practice the verse with the Kid-Os three times. You can start in your quiet/whisper voice and then get a little louder each time you practice.

Know This: The verse with actions goes like this: (Open your Bibles) Ephesians 6:10. (Point up) "Finally, let the Lord (flex muscles) make you strong. (Point up) Depend on His (Hands on hips) mighty power."


