#### Lesson 1: Trailhead

Have you ever created something really special? A piece of art, a comic book, a Lego project, or an invention? When you create something, it matters to you. You take time to make it just the way you want it to be. This week, we'll explore what it means to be created by God and how that impacts our lives.

#### Lesson 2: In the Crew

We all want to be a part of a group. Sometimes we even try to change things about ourselves so that we can fit in with the people around us. This week we will hear about how Jesus accepted someone that most people rejected.

#### Lesson 3: A New Horizon

Life can be challenging. It can feel like we are on an adventure with mountains to climb, rivers to cross, and obstacles that get in our way. Sometimes we wonder if we really have what it takes to do the things God wants us to do. This week, we will discover how God showed a man named Moses that he was capable.

#### **Lesson 4: Back on Track**

Have you ever lost something that was valuable? When that happens, we do anything we can to find it! It is incredible to know that God thinks we are valuable – so valuable that he would do whatever it takes to be close to us.

#### **Lesson 5: Outlook Point**

A good attitude is amazing. It can turn something challenging into something fun. A bad attitude, though, can turn even the most fun things into frustrating, difficult, and boring ones. This week, we'll see how our attitudes can change the world around us.

#### **Lesson 6: Long Way Home**

Sometimes our mistakes and the wrong things we do make us feel like no one could ever love us. We might feel like we have to do all the right things so that we can earn God's love. This week, we'll hear the story of The Lost Son and learn more about the incredible love God has for each one of us!

#### **Lesson 7: A Fork in the Trail**

Sometimes, it's easy to believe our choices don't matter, that they don't affect anyone. This week, we'll hear how Ruth learned that her choices really do make a difference; and we'll see how our decisions can impact others today.

#### **Lesson 8: Way-Words**

Our words can be used to help or to hurt. In Ephesians, Paul challenges us to use words that build others up. We'll find out what that looks like this week!

### **Lesson 9: The Next Step**

Daniel was in a new land with few friends. When others expected him to do things God says are wrong, Daniel had to choose whether to follow God or follow the people around him. This week, we'll discover the impact we can have when we stand up for what we believe.

#### **Lesson 10: Backtracked**

Imagine you've made a mistake. Something goes wrong, you mess up, but what happens next? Do you get angry? Give up? Blame someone else? Or could we see our mistakes in a different way? This week, we'll find out how our mistakes might even be a good thing.

#### **Lesson 11: Which Way?**

"Integrity" means doing what's right, even when no one is watching. This week, we'll hear how a man named Samuel chose integrity, even when others around him didn't.

#### **Lesson 12: Into the Unknown**

In the Bible, we see God tell people to be courageous, but it's not always for the reasons we'd expect. In Joshua's story, Joshua had to fight battles and lead a nation, but God said there was one thing he would do that would take even more courage than those things. We'll find out what it is this week!

#### Lesson 13: Onward!

King David's story doesn't start in a palace, it starts in a field. David was a shepherd, a musician, and a poet, and all of those were part of God's plan. As this new school year starts, we'll discover how everything we do is part of the way God designed us.



**Do This**: During the song, encourage kids to find a place to sit, and let them know it's time to get started.


Welcome everyone! I'm so glad you're all here! Come on up and find a place to sit.

Sometimes, we might believe that our words don't matter, that the things we say don't affect others. The truth, though, is that our words are super powerful. Check out this verse.

Proverbs 18:21- Your tongue has the power of life and death.
Do This: Read the verse from the screen.
Your tongue, meaning your words, have the power of life and death. This verse is called a "proverb," which is a wise saying that helps us understand life better. Proverbs use words to get us feeling and thinking a certain way. So what do you think that verse means? How do our words have the power of life and death?
What does that verse mean?
<b>Do This</b> : Allow 2-3 kids to answer.
Has someone ever said words that made you feel terrible, sad, or hopeless? Those words are powerful. Has someone ever said words that made you feel wonderful, joyful, and like you could do anything? Those words are powerful, too. That's the kind of power that verse is talking about.

So the big question is, what kind of words are we choosing? Are we choosing words that bring life, or words that harm other people?
Choosing words that help others starts by just thinking about what those words are. Let's give that a try now. I'm going to read a story, and when we get to a point in the story where someone talks, we'll have a couple choices for what they can say. You'll get to choose what option you think is best. Let's see the start of our story.
Another kid makes fun of your shoes. They tell other people. Before long, kids are chuckling at your when you walk by. You turn to some of them and say  A. Stop it! B. I don't like you. C. Please stop making fun of me.
Do This: Read the slide.

Talk to someone next to you about which one you think you would say. Which one do you think would give the most life?

**Do This**: Let kids talk for a minute. You could ask a couple of them to share as well.

If you yelled at them, or were mean to them, do you think that would stop them from being unkind? No, it'd probably just make them angry. If you asked them to stop, though, they'd probably realize that what they were doing hurt your feelings. If they keep on being unkind after you ask them to stop, though, you should probably tell your teacher or an adult you can trust about what's happening.

Let's look at another example.



You just got home, you're feeling tired, and your parent asks you to clean up something while they're getting dinner ready. You say...

- A. I'm so sick of that!
- B. Ugh, I guess I will.
- C. Sure, is there anything else I can help with?

**Do This**: Read the slide.

What do you think you would answer? Which one brings the most life and peace? What could happen if you said each one of these? Turn to someone next to you and talk about that.

**Do This**: Allow kids to talk for a minute or so. You may have one or two of them answer aloud.

That's an interesting one. Using angry, unkind words is a good way to get in trouble quickly, but B is a tough one. You're doing what they want, but having a bad attitude about it, and your words show that. Having a good attitude, asking if you can help, and even thanking them for getting dinner ready, are all great ways to use life-giving words. Here's one more example.



Your friend shows you a drawing they worked on. You say...

- A. That's ugly.
- B. I can draw better than you can.
- C. Wow, cool drawing! I can see you worked on that a lot.

**Do This**: Read the slide.

What do you think you would answer? Which one is most life-giving? Turn to someone next to you and talk about that.

**Do This**: Allow kids to talk for a minute or so. You may have one or two of them answer aloud.

You can probably guess which one of these would have the best reaction. Do you think your friend would feel good if you made fun of them, or told them you were better than they were? No, that would probably hurt their feelings. Instead, you could say someone worked hard, or find something good to say about what they did. Those words could make someone feel amazing.

The words we choose matter so much. In a minute, we'll hear a story from the Trailblazer team about the power of words, but before that, we've got a challenge to complete!
