Group Time Guide

Supplies Needed: Giving Story Page

1. Time to Talk

Look Up and Read: Acts 20:35. This verse tells us something important about giving.

Discussion Questions:

- Why do you think that verse says “It is more blessed to give than to receive”? What do you think that means? (Giving can make us feel even better than getting gifts does, and it helps others too.)
- What are some things we can give to help others? (Spend time helping someone, give money or gifts.)
- What is something you have been given? How did that make you feel?

Ask: How is this week going for you? Is there anything you want God’s help with?

Pray: Talk to God, including relevant things mentioned in your discussion.

2. Activity

Do This: Read the “Giving Story Page” with the kids. For each story, answer the questions beneath it. They will be focused on thinking about what we could give to help a person in that story.

Discuss: What are some ways we could give to help the people around us right now? (Listen to our brothers and sisters, or our parents, ask if we can help, give to help our church or other organizations we care about.)

The Point: Giving makes a big difference in our world. Every one of us can give in some way, whether that’s spending time with someone, helping someone, or giving what we have to help someone else.
