Discussion Questions

- 2. **Read Mark 4:1-20.** What do the four different types of seeds represent in this parable? Which one best represents you or someone else in your life right now?
- 3. Some of the best ways to sow seeds are to pray for people, model your faith, and invite people to church. Which one of these do you do well, and what do you need to work on? What will help you do all three of these things well?
- 4. **Read Romans 10:14.** When was the last time you sowed a seed of God's truth in someone's life? What is holding you back from generously scattering seeds?

Challenge
