**Kid-O-Deo — Toddler/36+
October 21/22
Noah and the Ark**

Open with Play Time

Welcome each Kid-O into the room as they arrive. Help them find a toy or game to encourage engagement during play time.

__:15 Music & Worship: Pick a song

Have Kid-Os use scarves, ribbons, or instruments as you lead them in singing. Encourage the Kid-Os to use their hands, feet, and voices as they worship God!

__:25 Snack & Bible Story

Gather the Kid-Os on the floor, use the hand sanitizer to wash their hands, and serve snack. Once Kid-Os are eating and settled, read from the story pages.

__:35 Activity: Imitate the Animals

Use the activity page to play the game.

__:45 Prayer

Pray the following prayer allowing Kid-Os to echo the lines after you if they so choose.

Dear God, we love you. Thank you for loving us, and please help us obey like Noah. Amen.

Noah and the Ark

Activity: Imitate the Animals

Materials: none

Say This: Today we are heard a story about Noah. He was obedient to God, and built a huge boat. Because Noah obeyed, he, his family, and all kinds of animals were saved from a big flood! Let's play a game now where we pretend to be different animals!

Do This: One by one, say the animals' names. Encourage Kid-Os to make their sounds and movements! Feel free to come up with other animals, and let Kid-Os give ideas too.

1. horse
2. cat
3. elephant
4. bird
5. donkey

What's the point? This activity will help Kid-Os be silly. They will get their wiggles out in a way that will help them obey the leader's commands. They will feel successful because they are most likely familiar with the animals listed.

Abram and the Move**

Open with Play Time

Welcome each Kid-O into the room as they arrive. Help them find a toy or game to encourage engagement during play time.

__:15 Music & Worship: Pick a song

Have Kid-Os use scarves, ribbons, or instruments as you lead them in singing. Encourage the Kid-Os to use their hands, feet, and voices as they worship God!

__:25 Snack & Bible Story

Abram and the Move

Activity: Let's Move!

Materials: Toddler music CD of your choice (optional)

Say This: We just heard a story about Abram, and how he obeyed God by moving his family when God said to move. For our activity today, we are going to move our bodies!

Do This: Play the toddler music CD or any music, if you'd like. Encourage the Kid-Os to move in place, imitating the leader's movements. If you have the space, lead the Kid-Os around the room as you move. The leader can choose how to move, and if you need them, ideas for movements are listed. Play as long as Kid-Os' attention span allows.

Movement Ideas:

- Jump
- March
- Windmill (swinging and moving arms back and forth)
- Run in place
- Walk

What's the point? This activity will help Kid-Os' gross motor skills and help them remember that Abram obeyed God by moving.

Moses and the Sea**

Open with Play Time

Welcome each Kid-O into the room as they arrive. Help them find a toy or game to encourage engagement during play time.

__:15 Music & Worship: Pick a song

Moses and the Sea

Activity: Move the Sea

Materials: Straws (1/Kid-O), pom pom balls

Say This: Today we heard about Moses and the Israelites. God told Moses to raise his stick so the Sea would part, and because Moses trusted God's power, the Israelites were saved! Today we're going to play a game where we will make a pretend sea move!

Do This: Have the Kid-Os sit in a circle and place the pom pom balls in front of a couple of Kid-Os at a time and give them each a straw. (Don't give everyone their straws at the same time.) Count to three and have the Kid-Os blow through their straws and try to move the pom pom balls away from them. In pairs or groups of three, give everyone a turn. For sanitary purposes, throw straws and pom pom balls away after the game is over.

What's the point? This game is loosely related to the Bible story and will help refine Kid-Os' fine motor and oral skills, as well as their hand-eye coordination.

Samuel and the Voice

Open with Play Time

Welcome each Kid-O into the room as they arrive. Help them find a toy or game to encourage engagement during play time.

__:15 Music & Worship: Pick a song

Have Kid-Os use scarves, ribbons, or instruments as you lead them in singing. Encourage the Kid-Os to use their hands, feet, and voices as they worship God!

__:25 Snack & Bible Story

Samuel and the Voice

Activity: Voices

Materials: None

Say This: We just heard a story about Samuel. He was a boy who heard God's voice! Today, we are going to practice using different voices.

Know This: This activity might get loud, and that's ok! Kid-Os should be having fun! You can choose different voices to use, but ideas are listed for you.

Do This: Have the Kid-Os stand up. Have Kid-Os repeat after you, using their voices in different ways:

- Volume: medium, quiet, super loud
- Animal voices: fish, puppy, cow, pig
- Speed: slow, medium, super fast

What's the Point? This fun activity will help Kid-Os to practice using their voices in different ways. It will also help them to understand what it means when they're asked to speak more loudly or quietly. The animal and speed-change voices are just for fun!

Open with Play Time

Welcome each Kid-O into the room as they arrive. Help them find a toy or game to encourage engagement during play time.

Say This: Today we heard the story of Joseph. Joseph made wise choices and that helped save many people, including his own family! Today, we are going to play Wise/Not Wise.

Do This: One by one, show Kid-Os the cards and ask them to tell you which illustrate wise choices and which show unwise choices. After going through the cards, ask Kid-Os to give you ideas of other wise or unwise choices.

What's the Point? This activity will help Kid-Os visualize, verbalize, and conceptualize what a wise choice looks like.

Nehemiah and the Wall**

Open with Play Time

Welcome each Kid-O into the room as they arrive. Help them find a toy or game to encourage engagement during play time.

__:15 Music & Worship: Pick a song

Have Kid-Os use scarves, ribbons, or instruments as you lead them in singing. Encourage the Kid-Os to use their hands, feet, and voices as they worship God!

__:25 Snack & Bible Story

Nehemiah and the Wall

Activity: Fix the Wall

Materials: blocks

Say This: Today we heard the story of Nehemiah. He wanted to fix the wall that protected God's special city, so he prayed and asked God for help. For today's activity, we are going to work together to fix a broken wall!

Do This: Scatter as many of the blocks as you'd like in front of the Kid-Os and place a few beside each other. Encourage everyone to stack blocks on top of the "foundation," to fix the wall.

Know This: You can have Kid-Os all build at the same time or take turns. This activity may go quickly; feel free to knock down the wall and rebuild it!

What's the Point? This activity will help Kid-Os remember that Nehemiah fixed the wall in Jerusalem. It will also help to refine Kid-Os' hand-eye coordination, as well as fine motor and spatial skills. It will also allow them to work on the social skill of teamwork and taking turns as they place the blocks.
